RESOLUTION NO. BA SE 20-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, SERVING AS THE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, GRANTING WITH APPROPRIATE CONDITIONS AND SAFEGUARDS A SPECIAL EXCEPTION AS AUTHORIZED UNDER SECTION 3.2 OF THE LAFAYETTE COUNTY LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS; PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL EXCEPTION TO THE PERMITTED USES WITHIN AN ENVIRONMENTALLY SENSITIVE AREA-2 (ESA-2) ZONING DISTRICT AS PROVIDED WITHIN SECTION 4.4.5 TO PERMIT THE LOCATION OF A RECREATIONAL VEHICLE CAMPGROUND WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR REVOCATION OF THE SPECIAL EXCEPTION; REPEALING RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Lafayette County Land Development Regulations, hereinafter referred to as the Land Development Regulations, empowers the Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County, Florida, serving as the Board of Adjustment of Lafayette County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Board of Adjustment, to grant, to grant with appropriate conditions and safeguards or deny special exceptions as authorized under Section 3.2 of said Land Development Regulations;

WHEREAS, a petition for a special exception, as described below, has been filed with the County;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Land Development Regulations, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Board of Adjustment, held the required public hearing, with public notice having been provided, on said petition for a special exception, as described below, and considered all comments received during said public hearing and the Concurrency Management Assessment concerning said petition for a special exception, as described below;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Board of Adjustment, has found that they are empowered under Section 3.2 of the Land Development Regulations to grant, to grant with appropriate conditions and safeguards or to deny a special exception, as described below;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Board of Adjustment, has determined and found that the granting with appropriate conditions and safeguards of the said petition for special exception, as described below, would promote the public health, safety, morals, order, comfort, convenience, appearance, prosperity or general welfare;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Board of Adjustment, has determined and found that the petitioner has proposed ingress and egress to the property and proposed structures thereon for automotive and pedestrian safety and convenience, in a manner that will not have an undue adverse impact on traffic flow and control, and access in case of fire or catastrophe;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Board of Adjustment, has determined and found that the special exception, as described below, is generally compatible with adjacent properties, other property in the district and natural resources;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Board of Adjustment, has determined and found that an application for a special exception, as described below, is in compliance with the provisions of Section 4.4.5 of the Land Development Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Board of Adjustment, has determined and found that:

- (a) The proposed use would be in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan and would not have an undue adverse effect on the Comprehensive Plan;
- (b) The proposed use is compatible with the established land use pattern;
- (c) The proposed use will not materially alter the population density pattern and thereby increase or overtax the load on public facilities such as schools, utilities, and streets;
- (d) The proposed use will not have an undue adverse influence on living conditions in the neighborhood;
- (e) The proposed use will not create or excessively increase traffic congestion or otherwise affect public safety;
- (f) The proposed use will not create a drainage problem;
- (g) The proposed use will not seriously reduce light and air to adjacent areas;
- (h) The proposed use will not adversely affect property values in the adjacent areas;
- (i) The proposed use will not be a deterrent to the improvement or development of adjacent property in accord with existing regulations; and
- (j) The proposed use is not out of scale with the needs of the neighborhood or the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, SERVING AS THE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. Pursuant to a petition, SE 20-01, by David Loren Robinson, requesting a special exception be granted as provided for in Section 4.4.5 of the Land Development Regulations, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Board of Adjustment, grants a special exception to permit the location of a recreational vehicle campground in accordance with a site plan dated March 3, 2030, submitted as part of a petition dated February 28, 2020 to be located on property described, as follows:

Parcel No. 11-07-14-0053-0010-00440

A parcel of land in Section 11, Township 07, Range 14, Lafayette County, Florida, being more particularly described as follows: Lot 44&45 Unit 1, Devils Elbow Subdivision PB A P 52-53 Public Records Lafayette CO FL or BK 262 P 151-152. Or BK 285 P 481 Utility Easement for Maintenance of Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal System or BK 294 P 186-187.

Containing 3.20 acres, more or less.

Section 2. A site plan, as described above and herewith made a part of this resolution by reference, shall govern the development and use of the above described property. Any deviation from the petition shall be deemed a violation of the Land Development Regulations.

Section 3. The use of land approved by this special exception shall be in place, or a valid permit shall be in force for the construction of such land use within twelve (12) months of the effective date of this resolution. If such land use is not in place or if a valid permit for the construction of such land use is not in effect, within twelve (12) months of the effective date of this resolution, this resolution granting with appropriate conditions and safeguards such special exception is thereby revoked and of no force and effect.


Section 4. All resolutions in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.


Section 5. This resolution shall become effective upon adoption.

AN ORDINANCE imposing a 6 cent local option gas tax on every gallon of motor fuel and special fuel sold in Lafayette County and taxed under the PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 206, FLORIDA STATUTES:


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA:


Section 1: That the Board of County Commissioners imposes a 6 cent local option gas tax of every gallon of motor fuel and special fuel sold in Lafayette County, Florida, and taxed under the provisions of CHAPTER 206, FLORIDA STATUTES. This imposition shall be for 5 years, beginning January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2025, and the Board reserves the right to amend or repeal this ordinance at the end of one year; also the County will continue to perform the maintenance of the Town of Mayo's roads and streets as the County has in the past, beginning January 1, 2021. A copy of the agreement between the County and the Town is attached.


Section 2: Effective Date: This ordinance shall be effective upon receipt of official acknowledgement from the Secretary of State that the ordinance has been duly filed by the County.





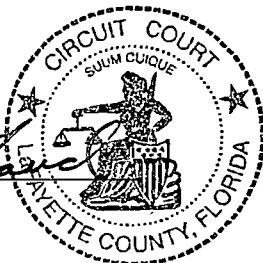

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT


BETWEEN LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA AND THE TOWN OF MAYO, FLORIDA

COMES NOW the Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County and the Town Council of the Town of Mayo and enter into the following interlocal agreement:

1. In accordance with 336.025 of the Florida Statutes, county transportation system; levy of local option gas tax on motor fuel and special fuel. Be it agreed that the Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County are in the process of enacting a 6 cent local option gas tax, for the time period beginning January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2025. The Town of Mayo through its Town Council is agreeable for the County to receive the revenues from this 6 cent local option gas tax and in consideration of the County receiving the revenues the County affirmatively agrees to maintain the roads in the Town of Mayo as the County has done in the past. The money received from this tax shall be utilized only for transportation expenditures.

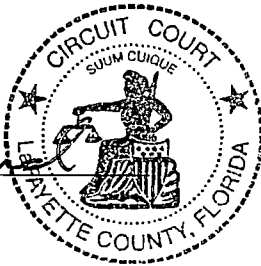

**BIDDING SPECIFICATIONS FOR NW SUMTER AVENUE SCOP IMPROVEMENTS
SECTION 00050 - AGREEMENT**

This AGREEMENT, made this 24th day of August, 2020 by and between THE LAFAYETTE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, hereinafter called OWNER and Anderson Columbia Co., Inc., doing business as a corporation hereinafter called "CONTRACTOR".

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the payments and agreements herein-after mentioned:

1. The CONTRACTOR will commence and complete the construction of the **NW SUMTER AVENUE SCOP IMPROVEMENTS**.
2. The CONTRACTOR will furnish all of the material, supplies, tools, equipment, labor and other services necessary for the construction and completion of the PROJECT described herein.
3. The CONTRACTOR shall use _____ as the Project Superintendent for the entire duration of the PROJECT described herein.
4. The CONTRACTOR will commence the work required by the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS within 10 calendar days after the date of the NOTICE TO PROCEED and will complete the same within **120** calendar days unless the period for completion is extended otherwise by the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.
5. The CONTRACTOR agrees to perform all the WORK described in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS and comply with the terms therein for the LUMP SUM of \$ 435,744.52 as shown in the Exhibit A - Attached
6. The term "CONTRACT DOCUMENTS" means and includes the following:
 - (A) ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS
 - (B) PROJECT OVERVIEW
 - (C) INFORMATION FOR BIDDERS
 - (D) BID
 - (E) BID BOND
 - (F) DRUG FREE WORKPLACE FORM
 - (G) CONFLICT OF INTEREST DISCLOSURE
 - (H) FORM OF AGREEMENT
 - (I) PERFORMANCE BOND
 - (J) PAYMENT BOND
 - (K) CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE
 - (F) NOTICE OF AWARD
 - (G) NOTICE TO PROCEED
 - (H) CHANGE ORDER
 - (I) GENERAL CONDITIONS
 - (J) APPLICATION FOR PAYMENT
 - (K) SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION
 - (L) SPECIFICATIONS

 - (N) ADDENDUMS ISSUED DURING BIDDING

Each of the listed CONTRACT DOCUMENTS are incorporated into this Agreement by reference.

7. The OWNER will pay to the CONTRACTOR in the manner and at such times as set forth in the General Conditions such amounts as required by the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.
8. This Agreement shall be binding upon all parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns.
9. All terms defined in this Agreement shall have the same meaning in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.
10. COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAWS: The successful BIDDER shall comply with all federal, state, and local statutes, laws, ordinances, rules and regulations in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement. In addition to compliance with any other laws of the State of Florida contained in Chapter 119, Fla. Stat., as the same may be amended. Failure to comply with the provisions of this subsections shall constitute a substantial failure to comply with the provisions of this subsections shall constitute a substantial failure to perform on the part of the successful BIDDER in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. Specifically, but not by way of limitation, successful BIDDER shall:
 - a. Keep and maintain public records required by OWNER to perform the service;
 - b. Upon request by OWNER'S custodian of public records, provide OWNER with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, or as otherwise provided by law;
 - c. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the term of this Agreement and following completion of the services to be provided by the successful BIDDER under this Agreement if the successful BIDDER does not transfer the records to OWNER; and
 - d. Upon completion of the services to be provided under this Agreement, transfer, at no cost to OWNER all public records in possession of the successful BIDDER or keep and maintain public records required by OWNER to perform the services. If the successful BIDDER keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the services, the successful BIDDER shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to OWNER, upon request from OWNER'S custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the OWNER.

The definitions contained in Chapter 119, Fla. Stat., apply to terms used in this section, unless alternate or more specific definitions for any such terms are provided in this Agreement.

For the purposes of this Agreement, the term "custodian of public records" shall mean the County Clerk of Court for Lafayette County, or his/her designee.






