Whereas, it is in the best interest of the Board of County Commissioners to allow only Very Low and Low income clients participation in the S.H.I.P. Owner Occupied Rehab Program.

Now therefore, be it resolved by the County Commission of Lafayette County, Florida;

That the maximum S.H.I.P. award limit for Purchase Assistance for Newly Constructed Homes for Very Low and Low income clients will increase from \$25,000.00 to \$30,000.00 and Moderate income clients will increase from \$20,000.00 to \$25,000.00.

That the maximum S.H.I.P. award limit for Purchase Assistance for Existing Homes with Rehabilitation for Very Low and Low income clients will increase from \$25,000.00 to \$30,000.00 and Moderate income clients will remain the same at \$20,000.00.

That only Very Low and Low income clients become eligible for the S.H.I.P. Owner Occupied Rehab Program. Therefore, disallowing moderate income clients from eligibility for the S.H.I.P. Owner Occupied Rehab Program.
