The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Thomas E. Pridgeon, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner Earnest Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan.

### **APPROVE THE MINUTES**

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

### **CLEANING PALM TREES AROUND COURTHOUSE**

Upon general consent, the Board agreed to have Mr. Marcus Calhoun oversee one of the Jail inmates cleaning the palm trees around the Courthouse.

### **OLD EMS TRAILER BEING USED BY ANOTHER WAY**

The Board discussed what to do with the Old EMS trailer that is currently being used by Another Way, Inc. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to give Another Way the option of buying the trailer from the Board for \$1.00 and do a lease on the county property where the trailer is located for them to be able to keep it in the same location.

### **SHIP PROGRAM ANNUAL REPORT**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the Board voted unanimously to have Ms. McMillan read the SHIP Program Annual Report Resolution in its entirety. On a motion by Mr. Pridgeon and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Resolution.

### **HARDENBERGH BOAT RAMP PROJECT BID**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to award the low bid in the amount of \$69,932.72 for the Hardenbergh Boat Ramp project to Ben Withers, Inc. pending the approval of the Florida Wildlife Commission.

**APPROVE THE BILLS**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, with the exception of the Pridgeon's Power Equipment bill, and the Paul Lamb bill the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills:

- General Fund - \$265,004.09
- E911 Fund - \$1,723.87
- Industrial Park Fund - \$66.88
- Transportation Improvement Fund - \$188,468.50
- Courthouse Renovation Reserve Fund - \$112,193.75

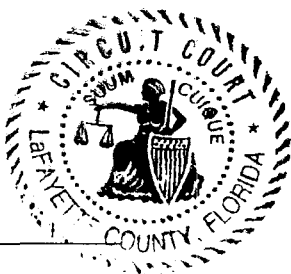



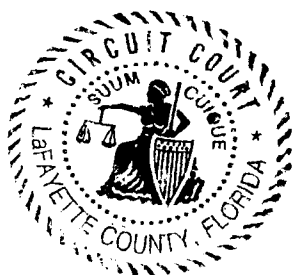
Now therefore, be it resolved by the County Commission of Lafayette County, Florida;

Dear Mr. Lyons:

The items discussed below must be provided before project review can be completed, as per Chapters 40B-4 and 40B-400, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). Please submit the following items to the Suwannee River Water Management District (District) by October 8, 2010.

1. The calculations to determine the setback were not found. Because this is not a single family house, the setback must be calculated. Please calculate the top of bank setback in accordance with the methodology in Urban Hydrology for Small watersheds and the Buffer Zone Study for the Suwannee River Water Management District.
2. Please provide the process used to find the OHWL.
3. The floodway line is not shown in any of the plans or survey. Please show the floodway line either on the survey or in the plans.
4. Please remove the spoil area from the floodplain and provide a note that the material is to be disposed of outside of the 100-year floodplain or account for the material as fill and provide compensating storage.
5. Preempted area, as defined in subsection 18-21.003(45), F.A.C, is the area of sovereignty submerged lands from which any traditional public uses have been or will be excluded by an activity, such as the area occupied by docks, piers, and other structures; the area between a dock and the shoreline where access is not allowed, between docks, or areas where mooring routinely occurs that are no longer reasonably accessible to the general public; permanent mooring areas not associated with docks; and swimming areas enclosed by nets, buoys, or similar marking systems. When the Board requires an activity to be moved waterward to avoid adverse resource impacts, the portion of the nearshore area that is avoided by the proposed activity shall not be included in the preempted area. For your project, the preempted area will be the area inside of your turbidity screens and silt fences below the OHWL.
