

SPECIFICATIONS FOR PEST CONTROL SERVICE

This specification is part of a comprehensive integrated pest management program for the Lafayette County Commission. This is a process for achieving long-term, environmentally sound pest suppression through the use of a variety of management practices. These practices include structural and procedural modifications that reduce pest access, food, moisture and harborage within the environment of the buildings occupied by staff of the Lafayette County Commission. Chemical methods are applied only on an "as needed" basis. Need is determined by pest population monitoring and previous unsuccessful attempts to solve the pest problem with non-chemical strategies. Control products are placed where they are inaccessible to staff and visitors.

Proposal Service Requirements

The Proposer shall furnish all supervision, labor materials and equipment necessary to accomplish the monitoring, trapping, chemical control methods and pest removal components of the integrated Pest Management program. The Proposer shall also provide site-specific recommendations for structural and procedural modifications to aid in pest prevention.

Terms and Payment

The service agreement shall begin on January 1, 2011, and shall continue for a period of three (3) years and from year to year thereafter until terminated. After the initial term, either party may terminate the proposed agreement upon 30 days written notice. Invoices will be paid on a monthly basis.

Insurance and Licenses

Proposer for services shall provide a copy of Insurance and Licenses.

Reports

A monthly service report will be required of the successful bidder. This report is provided to Lafayette County as evidence of the completed service showing each performed task.

Scheduled Tasks

This service program is designed to provide continuing spraying of pests and termites at the required buildings monthly. The tasks planned and scheduled are designed to provide for the long term care of the customer's property.

Maintenance

This will be a monthly program to check/spray for pests and/or termites. Turf management will be provided for the Courthouse and Library grounds.

Pests Included in Specifications

The Proposer shall adequately suppress the following pests:

- 1) Indoor populations of rats, mice, cockroaches, ants, flies, spiders and other arthropod pests not specifically excluded from the contract.
- 2) Populations of the above pests outside the buildings but within the county property.
- 3) Incidental invaders of concern (stinging or biting insects).
- 4) The following pests are excluded from this proposal:
 - A) Birds, bats and snakes.

On behalf of Mr. Akram Mckee and me, it was a pleasure to meet with you and your staff on December 7, 2010. The purpose of our visit was to provide land mobile radio technical assistance.

During our visit to Lafayette County, we visited two of your current VHF-High Band (VHF-HB) radio sites, including the Mayo site and the Hatch Bend site. We also discussed several issues related to your VHF-HB radio system, which mainly define our scope of work as follows:

- Provide a solution for narrowbanding the existing VHF-HB radio system
- Improve the handheld radio coverage in the eastern region of the county
- Eliminate the need of switching channels while officers are traveling throughout the county
- Provide an engineering report with budgetary estimates to resolve issues listed above
- Clarify the use of Lafayette County Sheriff's Office approved Intergovernmental Radio Communications Program (\$12.50 fund) to cover related radio system expenses
