

REGULAR MEETING
FEBRUARY 22, 2010
5:30 P.M.

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The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Thomas E. Pridgeon, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner T. Jack Byrd, Dist. 4; Commissioner Earnest Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan.

APPROVE THE MINUTES

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

EMS RESOLUTION

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to have Ms. McMillan read an EMS Resolution by title only. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the EMS Resolution allowing EMS to purchase medical equipment with leftover grant money.

REZONE COUNTY PROPERTY TO COMMERCIAL

Mr. Bobby Johnson discussed with the Board rezoning the 18.16 acres where the Health Department, Road Department, etc. are located to commercial for future County use. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to allow Mr. Johnson to begin the advertising procedure to rezone this property and to take the issue before the Town Council, because part of the property is in the City limits, for their approval also.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT EXEMPTION REQUESTS

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to leave the requirements for special assessment exemption at \$9,500 for single and \$11,500 for family (2 or more). On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to accept the Special Assessment exemption requests that qualify as presented by the Lafayette County Tax Collector.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH TOWN OF MAYO

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the Board voted unanimously to have Ms. McMillan read Interlocal Agreement, Ordinance 2010-01, by title only. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the Ordinance continuing the 6 cent local option gas tax for a five year period.

OPEN BIDS FOR NEW PICK-UP TRUCK

The Board opened bids for a new pick-up truck for the Road Department. The following bids were turned in: Don Reid Ford - \$24,451.00; Rountree Ford - \$25,678.65; Dixie Chevrolet - \$28,847.53; and Timberland Ford - \$24,358.00. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the board voted unanimously to have Mr. Hamlin, Mr. Ricky Lyons and Mr. Edward Dodd review all bids and make a decision.

OPEN BIDS FOR COMMERCIAL GRADE ZERO TURN MOWER

The Board opened bids for a new commercial grade zero turn mower for the Road Department. The following bids were turned in: Pippin Tractor - \$10,996.00; Byrd's Power Equipment Bid A - \$9,344.86; Byrd's Power Equipment Bid B - \$9,734.30 Suwannee River Kubota - \$9,100.00; Pridgeon's Power Equipment - \$7,998.00; John's Lawn Equipment - \$9,765.00; Live Oak Tractor - \$13,971.82; Gordon Tractor Bid A - \$9,268.80; Gordon Tractor Bid B - \$9,588.80. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, with Mr. Byrd and Mr. Pridgeon abstaining, the Board voted unanimously to award the bid to the low bidder, Pridgeon's Power Equipment.

APPROVE THE BILLS

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Jones, with the exception of the Pridgeon's Power Equipment bill, the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills:

- General Fund - \$37,306.92
- Industrial Park Fund - \$29.13
- Courthouse Renovation Reserve Fund - \$17,193.75
- Transportation Improvement Fund - \$13,468.50
- Emergency 911 Fund - \$38,675.00

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, with Mr. Pridgeon abstaining, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Pridgeon's Power Equipment bill in the amount of \$1,483.69.

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REQUEST LETTER TO NAME FIELD AT RECREATION COMPLEX

The Board reviewed a letter of request to name a field at the Recreation Complex. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to research the idea further to make sure there were not any more candidates with the same qualifications.


LIFE SCAN FINGERPRINT ENROLLMENT SYSTEM

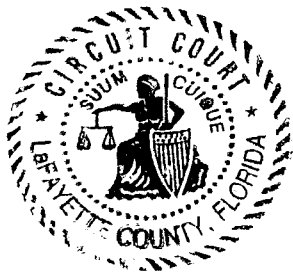



ORDINANCE NO. 2010-01

AN ORDINANCE imposing a 6 cent local option gas tax on every gallon of motor fuel and special fuel sold in Lafayette County and taxed under the PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 206, FLORIDA STATUTES:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That the Board of County Commissioners imposes a 6 cent local option gas tax of every gallon of motor fuel and special fuel sold in Lafayette County, Florida, and taxed under the provisions of CHAPTER 206, FLORIDA STATUTES. This imposition shall be for 5 years, beginning January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2015, and the Board reserves the right to amend or repeal this ordinance at the end of one year; also the County will continue to perform the maintenance of the Town of Mayo's roads and streets as the County has in the past, beginning January 1, 2011. A copy of the agreement between the County and the Town is attached.

Section 2: Effective Date: This ordinance shall be effective upon receipt of official acknowledgement from the Secretary of State that the ordinance has been duly filed by the County.

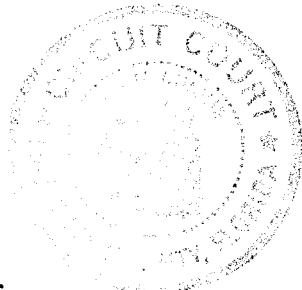

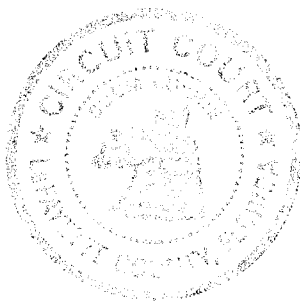
INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

BETWEEN LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA AND THE TOWN OF MAYO, FLORIDA

COMES NOW the Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County and the Town Council of the Town of Mayo and enter into the following interlocal agreement:

1. In accordance with 336.025 of the Florida Statutes, county transportation system; levy of local option gas tax on motor fuel and special fuel. Be it agreed that the Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County are in the process of enacting a 6 cent local option gas tax, for the time period beginning January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2015. The Town of Mayo through its Town Council is agreeable for the County to receive the revenues from this 6 cent local option gas tax and in consideration of the County receiving the revenues the County affirmatively agrees to maintain the roads in the Town of Mayo as the County has done in the past. The money received from this tax shall be utilized only for transportation expenditures.

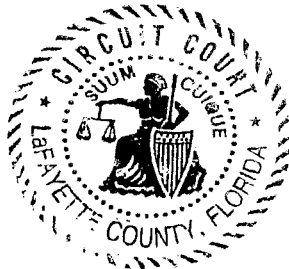
WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners recognizes that no other resources exist to provide these particular project goals to the County of Lafayette,


