

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County deem it to be in the best interest of Lafayette County and the citizens of Lafayette County to enter into a supplemental agreement adding the funds for the resurfacing or reconstruction of CR 351 from SW CR 534 to Pleasant Grove Baptist Church in Lafayette County. In addition, construction funds will be reduced in the amount of \$344,757.00 due to bid overage. The total funds to be reduced in Supplemental #1 are \$493,785.00, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation has provided a "State of Florida Department of Transportation, Small County Road Assistance Program", and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that it is in the best interest of the Board to enter into and execute such agreement.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, that the Chairperson of the Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County, Florida is authorized to execute said agreement.
