WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Lange , Florida, has made the following determinations:

- 1. Several years ago, the Florida Supreme Court reversed long-standing precedent by finding that constitutional office's deputies are entitled to engage in collective bargaining.
- 2. Currently, two Florida Sheriffs (Clay County and Pasco County) have been immediately impacted by the Public Employees Relations Commission (PERC) decision regarding the negotiation's impasse with the Fraternal Order of Police.
- 3. Both suits arise from a situation in which a union has questioned the existing impasse resolution language in F.S. 447.203 (10) because it contains a requirement that a "Legislative Body," in these cases, a constitutional officer, have, among other requirements, the authority to appropriate funds.
- 4. The Florida Senate and the Florida House has begun debate on Senate Bill 610 and House Bill 417, to identify the Sheriff, Tax Collector, Property Appraiser, Supervisor of Elections and the Clerk of Court as the legislative body of their respective employees and NOT the Board of County Commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Lahry to County, Florida.

Section 1: The foregoing recitals contained in the preamble to this Resolution are

incorporated by reference.

Section 2: This Board supports the adoption of proposed Senate Bill 610 and House Bill

417.

Section 3: The County Administrator is hereby directed to send a copy of this resolution to

Governor Charlie Crist, The County's Legislative Delegation and the Executive

Director of the Florida Association of Counties.

Section 4: This Resolution shall take effect upon it adoption.
