REGULAR MEETING JANUARY 24, 2011 5:30 P.M.

The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Gail Garrard, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner T. Jack Byrd, Dist. 4; Commissioner Earnest Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan-Fredriksson.

APPROVE THE MINUTES

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

LAFAYETTE COUNTY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

Mr. Milton Ceraso, with the Lafayette County Development Authority, discussed with the Board doing an addition to the south side of the building for Mr. Moses with Agri-Metal Supply. The addition has already been approved by the Development Authority, and they wanted the approval of the Board before proceeding. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve the addition. The funds will come from Industrial Park rental account.

LAFAYETTE COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS

Mr. Michael Frier discussed purchasing a turbo charger for the lowboy truck for \$1,100. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the purchase with Mr. Byrd checking with North Florida truck parts first to see what their price would be. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to repair the clutch on the Ford tractor so that it can be sold, and to remove the bush cutter from it before it is sold.

FEMA RISK MAPPING

Mr. Doug McBriarity discussed updating the study plan for the FEMA maps. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve the updated study plan. (See attached.)

LAURA'S LANE SUBDIVISION

Mr. Bobby Johnson discussed preliminary approval for splitting some of the lots in Laura's Lane Subdivision into one 10 acre lot and two 5 acre lots for Levis Lawson, Jr. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to grant preliminary approval for the project.

PROCESS FOR ACCEPTING YARD TRASH AT COLLECTION SITE

The Board discussed establishing a price for accepting yard trash at the old landfill collection site. The decision was made to get information from surrounding counties to see what they charge for yard trash. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to table the issue until the next meeting.

PUBLIC WORKS JOB DESCRIPTION

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to approve the description for the Public Works Director position and to advertise for the position.

BUILDING/ZONING AND PUBLIC SAFETY ASSISTANT POSITION

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve the description for the Building/Zoning and Public Safety Assistant position. On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to advertise for the position.

EMS/SOLID WASTE BILLING PROCEDURE

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the billing procedure pending changes being made to the procedures list. (See attached.)

HARDENBERGH BOAT RAMP PROJECT

Mr. Phil Bishop with North Florida Professional Services discussed the Hardenbergh Boat Ramp project with the Board and additional work that they might want done with extra grant money that will be available for this project. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to allow Mr. Bishop to get some prices for additional work and report back to them. Mr. Bishop also discussed with the Board supervising the Hardenbergh Boat Ramp project for an additional cost of \$5,400.00 for his services. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to allow Mr. Bishop to supervise the job. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board

voted unanimously to release the final payment of \$7,462.50 for the project plans to North Florida Professional Services.

APPROVE INVOICE FOR SCARIFIER

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the invoice for the scarifier attachment to the new road grader for the Road Department. The cost is \$5,900.00.

SHERRI LAND, OLD COLD STORAGE LOT

Mrs. Sherri Land discussed deeding the Old Cold Storage lot to the county. After discussion and advice from the County Attorney, on a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to have Ms. McMillan write a letter of intent to the Town Council, because the property is located in the city limits, without accepting liability until the title search can be done on the property and the deed transfer can take place.

DECLARE FEBRUARY 13-19, 2011 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AWARENESS WEEK

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to declare February 13-19, 2011 as Hazardous Materials Awareness Week.

EMS BILLING PAST DUE ACCOUNTS

The Board discussed how to proceed with collecting money on EMS billing past due accounts. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to send a letter first to the account holders and if they fail to respond, send their information to a collections agency.

Notes:

The purpose of the telecom meeting was to inform Lafayette County of the revised study plan and receive concurrence. Originally, Steinhatchee Springs and Cooks Hammock were approved for study based upon limited funds. The County's first priority area is the Adams/Picket Lakes area. The County requested this area be studied also.

SRWMD applied for additional FEMA funds for Lidar coverage of the area. Also, 2010 RiskMapping funds became available.

The study of the three Lafayette County priority areas will be performed over a two-year period. The two riverine areas, Steinhatchee Springs and Cooks Hammock will be started first. Lidar exists for the Steinhatchee area and the Cooks Hammock area will require some survey for riverine cross section. The Adams/Pickett Lakes area will begin after receipt of the new processed Lidar. That Lidar should be available for use late spring, early summer.

Bobby Johnson, Lafayette County Floodplain Manager, concurred with the revised plan. Bobby said it would be a good idea to make a short presentation to the Board of County Commissioners to get their approval, since they are the county decision-makers. A presentation is scheduled for the January 24, 2011 at 5 p.m. in Mayo. AECOM will send Bobby a draft of the presentation mid January for comments.
