The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Gail Garrard, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner T. Jack Byrd, Dist. 4; Commissioner Earnest L. Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan-Fredriksson.

APPROVE THE MINUTES

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

REQUEST FOR CHANGE TO SPECIAL EXCEPTION BY DEAN REVELS

Mr. Dean Revels requested permission from the Board to make a change to his Special Exception regarding the Silver Dollar Lounge. He has a new tenant in the facility and she is requesting to sell alcoholic beverages in the facility. He requested that his Special Exception fee be waived since he had already paid it with the previous tenant. He agrees to pay all other costs. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to approve waiving his Special Exception fee since it was previously paid and for Mr. Revels to pay all other costs.

SUWANNEE RIVER WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT CHECK PRESENTATION

Mr. David Still and Mr. Al Alexander presented the Board with a check in the amount of \$77,306.21 for payment in lieu of taxes from the Suwannee River Water Management District. No action was taken on this issue.

APPROVE THE BILLS

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mrs. Garrard, with the exception of the Byrd's Power Equipment bill and the B's Starters & Alternators bill, the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills:

General Fund - \$289,409.07
Industrial Park Fund - \$275.00
Emergency 911 Fund - \$1,220.52
Capital Projects Fund - \$10,880.98

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mrs. Garrard, with Mr. Byrd abstaining, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Byrd's Power Equipment bill in the amount of \$76.31 and the B's Starters & Alternators bill in the amount of \$200.00.

REQUEST TO WAIVE PAYMENT OF BOND FOR EOC PROJECT

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve waiving a bond payment for the EOC project since it will be built as a construction management project and all purchases will be made by the county.

RE-APPOINT JANA HART TO THE WELLFLORIDA COUNCIL BOARD

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to re-appoint Mrs. Jana Hart to the WellFlorida Council Board.

RECENT FIRE AT THE INDUSTRIAL PARK

The Board discussed with the Mr. John Pat Thomas with the Florida League of Cities the recent fire at the Industrial Park and what action needs to be taken at this point. Mr. Thomas recommended holding a meeting to discuss this further with Mr. Ricky Lyons, Mr. Steve Land, Mr. Donnie Land, Mr. Mike Matheny, Mr. Will Rutherford, one member from the Board and himself. On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to appoint Mr. Donnie Hamlin as the Board representative at this meeting.

RAISE FOR COUNTY EMPLOYEES

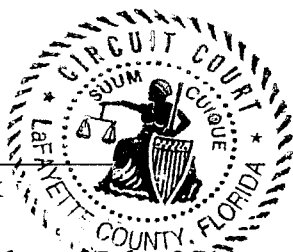



Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. For this reason, please pay close attention to the instructions on this form before completing the reverse side and filing the form.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 112.3143, FLORIDA STATUTES

A person holding elective or appointive county, municipal, or other local public office **MUST ABSTAIN** from voting on a measure which inures to his or her special private gain or loss. Each elected or appointed local officer also is prohibited from knowingly voting on a measure which inures to the special gain or loss of a principal (other than a government agency) by whom he or she is retained (including the parent organization or subsidiary of a corporate principal by which he or she is retained); to the special private gain or loss of a relative; or to the special private gain or loss of a business associate. Commissioners of community redevelopment agencies under Sec. 163.356 or 163.357, F.S., and officers of independent special tax districts elected on a one-acre, one-vote basis are not prohibited from voting in that capacity.

Although you must abstain from voting in the situations described above, you otherwise may participate in these matters. However, you must disclose the nature of the conflict before making any attempt to influence the decision, whether orally or in writing and whether made by you or at your direction.

IF YOU INTEND TO MAKE ANY ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION PRIOR TO THE MEETING AT WHICH THE VOTE WILL BE TAKEN:

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Dear Mr. Sadler:

As you may recall, we have spoken by telephone regarding County mowing activities on the three County roads which run through Mutual Land Company timberlands (Brushy Hammock Road, Long Tressel Tram, and McCray Grade). Our primary concern at our last conversation was the damage that was occurring to our pine trees. Since that time the damage problem seems to have gotten better, and I thank you for your help in making sure your machine operators are sensitive to this issue.

However because of the mowing, Mutual's owners fear that your grader operators may now be inclined to widen the presently graded road-width which should be about thirty (30) feet. The owners of Mutual Land Company have asked me to make sure we have an understanding of what the County road-width is on roads running through our timberlands, and that is the purpose of this letter.

I have discussed this matter with Mr. Lyons, Lafayette County Clerk of Court, and he tells me there is no document in the County records that specifically designates a road-width for the subject roads. However he does say that when the County accepts a road for maintenance it must be at least thirty feet in width, and this is likely the width that we should be using.

So by copy of this letter I would like to say that Mutual Land Company accepts that County roads running through our property should be about thirty (30) feet in width, and that the existing graded surface should not be expanded without our consent. This is an important issue for us, and we request that you work with us to prevent any encroachments.

AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR CDBG GRANT APPLICATION AND ADMINISTRATION SERVICES

The "Agreement for CDBG Application and Administration Services", by and between the Lafayette County Board of County Commissioners and Roumelis Planning and Development Services, Inc., dated July 12, 2010, is hereby amended to add the following section:

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XVII. *Section 3 Clause.*

(A) The work to be performed under this contract is subject to the requirements of Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, 12 USC §1701u (Section 3). The purpose of Section 3 is to ensure that employment and other economic opportunities generated by HUD assistance or HUD-assisted projects covered by Section 3, shall, to the greatest extent feasible, be directed to low- and very low-income persons, particularly persons who are recipients of HUD assistance for housing.

(B) The parties to this contract agree to comply with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR Part 135, which implement Section 3. As evidenced by their execution of this contract, the parties to this contract certify that they are under no contractual or other impediment that would prevent them from complying with the Part 135 regulations.

(C) The contractor agrees to send to each labor organization or representative of workers with which the contractor has a collective bargaining agreement or other understanding, if any, a notice advising the labor organization or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this Section 3 clause, and will post copies of the notice in conspicuous places at the work site where both employees and applicants for training and employment positions can see the notice. The notice shall describe the Section 3 preference, shall set forth minimum number and job titles subject to hire, availability of apprenticeship and training positions, the qualifications for each; and the name and location of the person(s) taking applications for each of the positions; and the anticipated date the work shall begin.

(D) The contractor agrees to include this Section 3 clause in every subcontract subject to compliance with regulations in 24 CFR Part 135, and agrees to take appropriate action, as provided in an applicable provision of the subcontract or in this Section 3 clause, upon a finding that the subcontractor is in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR part 135. The contractor will not subcontract with any subcontractor where the contractor has notice or knowledge that the subcontractor has been found in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR Part 135.

(E) The contractor will certify that any vacant employment positions, including training positions, that are filled (1) after the contractor is selected but before the contract is executed, and (2) with persons other than those to whom the regulations of 24 CFR part 135 require employment opportunities to be directed, were not filled to circumvent the contractor's obligations under 24 CFR Part 135.

(F) Noncompliance with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR Part 135 may result in sanctions, termination of this contract for default, and debarment or suspension from future HUD assisted contracts.

(G) With respect to work performed in connection with Section 3 covered Indian housing assistance, section 7(b) of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450e) also applies to the work to be performed under this contract. Section 7(b) requires that to the greatest extent feasible (i) preference and opportunities for training and employment shall be given to Indians, and (ii) preference in the award of contracts and subcontracts shall be given to Indian organizations and Indian-owned Economic Enterprises. Parties to this contract that are subject to the provisions of Section 3 and Section 7(b) agree to comply with Section 3 to the maximum extent feasible, but not in derogation of compliance with Section 7(b).





