The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Gail Garrard, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner T. Jack Byrd, Dist. 4; Commissioner Earnest Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan-Fredriksson.

### **APPROVE THE MINUTES**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

### **REQUEST TO ALLOW EMS WORKERS TO TAKE FIRE TRAINING COURSE**

Mr. Donnie Land discussed with the Board about allowing EMS workers who are interested to take the Fire Training Course and the estimated cost to the county for the course will be \$307.00 per person. On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to go ahead with the application process for the training and informed Mr. Trevor Hicks to make sure that all individuals interested are registered to take the course.

### **OPEN BIDS FOR GENERATOR FOR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

Mr. Donnie Land suggested that the Board table this issue until the next meeting for him to take a further look at the bids before presenting them to the Board. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to table the issue.

### **REQUEST FOR 24-HOUR EMS BACK-UP CREW**

Mr. Trevor Hicks and Mrs. Leta Hawkins discussed with the Board the possibility of having a stand-by back-up crew (around 6 people) who are on call to back up crews already on duty. On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to have Mr. Hicks discuss the costs associated with a back-up crew with the Finance Department and report them back to the Board for consideration.

### **DEBBIE BELCHER – CDBG HOUSING GRANT**

Mrs. Debbie Belcher presented the Board with a copy of the applicants for the CDBG Housing Grant. After discussion was held, Mrs. Belcher said she would revise the list for

approval and meet with the Citizen Advisory Task Force regarding all applicants before presenting the list back to the Board. No action was taken on this issue.

### **ARRA ENERGY CONSERVATION SEP GRANT**

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to accept Roumelis Planning and Development Services as the only firm who turned in a bid to administer the ARRA Energy Conservation SEP Grant.

### **ADOPT A PROCLAMATION DECLARING JUNE 15, 2011 AS WORLD ELDER ABUSE AWARENESS DAY**

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to adopt a Proclamation declaring June 15, 2011 as World Elder Abuse Awareness Day.

### **APPROVE THE BILLS**

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills, with the exception of the Byrd's Power Equipment bill:

General Fund - \$367,595.22

Development Authority Fund - \$113.58

E911 Fund - \$1,445.48

Capital Projects Fund - \$1,644.45

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mrs. Garrard, with Mr. Byrd abstaining, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Byrd's Power Equipment bill in the amount of \$51.52.

### **APPROVE HIRING EVA BOLTON FOR 4-H SIX WEEK PROGRAM**

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve hiring Eva Bolton for the six week 4-H Program for the youth in Lafayette County as recommended by Jana Hart.

### **APPROVE PAM WARD TO THREE RIVERS REGIONAL LIBRARY BOARD**

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve appointing Pam Ward to the Three Rivers Regional Library Board as the citizen representative for Lafayette County retroactive back to June 9, 2011.

### **AMENDMENTS TO THE LAFAYETTE COUNTY PERSONNEL POLICY**

Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson discussed amendments to be made to the Lafayette County Personnel Policy with the Board. On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve a 10% increase in pay for employees after their 6 month

probationary period has expired if all conditions of probation have been met and approved by their Department Head, then brought to the Board for approval. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to approve employees contributing 3% towards their retirement plan to be consistent with state statutes. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to add to the policy that no more than 2 employees per department be off at a time. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a motion by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve that new employees will not be able to use paid sick days until completion of 6 months of work. Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson will make changes to the policy for inclusion with other Board policies.

**APPROVE THE MAY SOLID WASTE/BUILDING DEPARTMENT REPORTS**

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve the May Solid Waste/Building Department monthly billing reports.


**REQUEST FOR PAY INCREASE FOR TWO ROAD DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES**



5.6. Retirement Plan – County employees are included in the Retirement System of the State of Florida. The County contributes a percentage of each employee's salary to the plan. The employee shall contribute 3% of the employee's salary to the plan. Booklets explaining the program are provided at appointment.

Revised and Adopted June 13, 2011. All policies in conflict are repealed. Section 5.6 Retirement Plan is replaced in its entirety.

**Section 5 Pay and Benefits**

g. Probationary Employees-Pay Increase – Upon completion of the required probationary period, a regular 40 hour employee may be eligible for a 10% pay increase. Upon successful completion of the probationary period, the Department Head may submit a written and signed request stating that “the employee has successfully completed his/her probationary period of six months” and that the employee is eligible for a 10% pay increase. Said request shall be submitted to the Board for approval on the Board approved form and include performance evaluations. If employee has not successfully completed his/her probationary period of six months, the county commissioners, at their discretion, may extend the probationary period for an additional number of months.

**Section 6 – Leave Policy**

6.1 General

a. Request for annual leave will be made in writing to the Department Head by employees, or to the Appointing Authority by Department Heads. Seniority will be considered in developing the department's leave schedule. The Department Head has full authority to establish the leave schedule that is subject to change by the Department Head or the Appointing Authority in the event of changing operation or emergency requirements.

b. No payment shall be made for accrued annual or sick leave upon compulsory resignation or dismissal of an employee.

### 6.3 Sick Leave

1. Sick leave is to be considered a privilege, not a right, sick leave will be charged in the amount used, rounded up to the next full hour. Sick leave will not be granted for any sickness, injury or disability arising from a criminal act on the part of the employee.

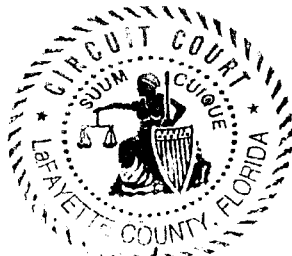
- Whereas,** Lafayette County's seniors are valued members of society and it is our responsibility to ensure they live safely and with dignity; and

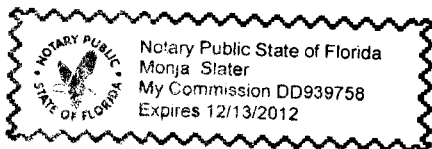
