EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, is made by and between Lafayette County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, located at 120 W. Main St. Mayo, Florida (hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY), and Brian Lamb, as Sheriff of Lafayette County. Florida, a County Constitutional Officer of the State of Florida, a/k/a the Lafayette County Sheriff's Office, located at 231 Monroe Ave., Mayo, Florida (hereinafter referred to as the SHERIFF):

WHEREAS, the COUNTY desires to transfer and SHERIFF agrees to accept the job functions and equipment of the Lafayette County Division of Emergency Management;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual terms, covenants, and conditions herein contained to be complied with by the COUNTY and the SHERIFF, both parties hereto contract and agree as follows:

- 1. The COUNTY agrees to delegate and the SHERIFF agrees to accept the responsibilities and requirements for the job functions and equipment of the Lafayette County Division of Emergency Management. Such functions shall include, but not be limited to, emergency preparedness and other such related functions as may be agreed to by the COUNTY and the SHERIFF;
- The COUNTY and the SHERIFF agree that the Lafayette County Division of Emergency Management shall operate under the direction of the SHERIFF consistent with Chapter 252, Florida Statutes.
- The COUNTY and the SHERIFF agree that the Director of the Lafayette County Division of Emergency Management shall be appointed in accordance with Chapter 252. Florida Statutes,
- 4. The COUNTY and the SHERIFF agree that the Director of Lafayette County Division of Emergency Management shall report to the SHERIFF for normal operation. However, the Director will report directly to the COUNTY in time of an emergency or a disaster declared under Chapter 252, Florida Statutes.
- The COUNTY and the SHERIFF agree that all employees of the Lafayette County Division of Emergency Management shall be employees of the SHERIFF and be subject to the SHERIFF'S personnel rules and regulations therein, except that those employees who are working for the COUNTY at the time this Agreement is executed shall be allowed to continue COUNTY benefits, to be paid by the SHERIFF, and as agreed by the SHERIFF, and as agreed to by the employee and the SHERIFF;
- The COUNTY and the SHERIFF agree that the SHERIFF shall assume responsibility as Fiscal
 Agent for all operating costs associated with the Lafayette County Division of Emergency
 Management;

- 7. The COUNTY and the SHERIFF agree that the SHERIFF shall be responsible for all financial responsibilities pertaining to emergency management and is delegated the authority to sign all agreements, contracts and grants received from local, state and federal entities. The Sheriff is responsible for the submission of all grant documentation and related reimbursement expenses to the State of Florida and/ or to the appropriate Federal Agencies in accordance with applicable statutes, rules and regulations;
- The COUNTY and the SHERIFF agree that this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party.
- The COUNTY and the SHERIFF agree that this Agreement shall commence on July 1,
 2013, and shall run in perpetuity unless terminated in accordance with #8 above.
- 10. The COUNTY and the SHERIFF agree that this Agreement shall survive political elections regardless of the makeup of the COUNTY and the SHERIFF;
- Any notices required under this Agreement shall be to the COUNTY, c/o The Board of County Commissioners, PO Box 88 Mayo, Florida 32066 and to the SHERIFF, Brian Lamb, Lafayette County Sheriff's Office, P.O. Box 227 Mayo, Florida 32066
- 12. The COUNTY and the SHERIFF agree that to the extent allowed by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Florida, and pursuant to the restrictions and requirements of Florida Statutes, Section 768.28, the COUNTY hereby agrees to indemnify, defend, save, and hold harmless the SHERIFF from all claims, demands, liabilities, and suits arising out of, because of or due to any negligent act of the COUNTY, its agents, or employees arising out of this Emergency Management Interlocal Agreement. It is specifically understood and agreed that this indemnification clause does not cover or indemnify the SHERIFF for his negligence or breach of contract, or that of his agents or employees. That to the extent allowed by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Florida, and pursuant to the restrictions and requirements of Florida Statutes. Section 768.28, the SHERIFF liabilities, and suits arising out of this Emergency Management Interlocal Agreement. It is specifically understood and agreed that this indemnification clause does not cover or indemnify the COUNTY for its negligence or breach of contract, or that of its agents or employees.

I prefer that individual employees (by name) not be discussed in an open meeting. Of course, if the employee is at the meeting and agrees, then he/she can be discussed. With regard to personnel records and any punishment, those records are public records. Those records should be kept separate from patient records and in the personnel file of the employee.

If an individual/citizen attends a meeting and wants to talk about a specific employee in the meeting without the employee there, that is prohibited. If the same individual would like to meet with a supervisor and the employee and go over the punishment/suspension that was administered, then that is required because that action by the county is public record.

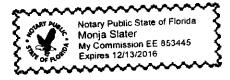

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF MONEY FOR THE PURCHASE OF A GARBAGE TRUCK BY LAFAYETTE COUNTY, AUTHORIZING THE PLEDGE OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY'S LOCAL GOVERNMENT HALF-CENT SALES TAX REVENUES TO SECURE PAYMENT THEREOF, DESIGNATING THE LOAN TO QUALIFY FOR TAXEXEMPT STATUS, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Lafayette County (hereinafter referred to as the "County") has previously approved the expenditure of ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$175,000.00) DOLLARS for the purchase of a garbage truck, as a capital expenditure item; and WHEREAS, it would be advantageous for the County to borrow the funds necessary to pay for the purchase of this garbage truck, and repay those funds over a period of time; and WHEREAS, the County is authorized by law to pledge the County's local government half-cent sales tax revenues for payment of principal and interest on such capital expenditure; and

WHEREAS, the County has followed all applicable rules and regulations in selecting a lender, and has chosen Lafayette State Bank as the lender.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by Lafayette County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, as follows:

Section 1. Lafayette County is authorized to borrow the principal sum of ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$175,000.00) DOLLARS, from the Lafayette State Bank (hereinafter referred to as the "Bank"), for a period of three (3) years, with an interest rate of one and sixty-five one-hundreds percent (1.65%) per annum, for the financing of the above stated capital expenditure. Provided, however, that in the event the interest received by the Bank must be treated as taxable income for federal or state income tax purposes, said interest rate may be increased to an interest rate sufficient to provide the Bank the same rate of return after taxes as

would be earned by the interest rate of one and sixty-five one-hundreds percent (1.65%) per annum when no federal or state income tax is due and owning on said interest. And provided further that this debt shall not constitute a general obligation of Lafayette County and the faith and credit of Lafayette County shall not be pledged for repayment of the same. Repayment of this obligation shall be solely from the County's local government half-cent sales tax revenues.

Section 2. The County's local government half-cent sales tax revenues may be pledged as collateral for repayment of said obligation.

Section 3. The Promissory Note and Lien Agreement as attached to this Resolution is hereby approved, and the Chairman is authorized to execute said document together with any further documents necessary to effect this transaction on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County, Florida.

Section 4. Lafayette County desires to qualify the above referenced Promissory Note and Lien Agreement for the small governmental units exception to the arbitrage rebate requirements imposed by Section 148(f) of the IRS Code upon tax-exempt obligations such as the said Promissory Note and Lien Agreement, which is issued after September 1, 1986; and the Board of County Commissioners does hereby find and determine that Lafayette County is a governmental unit with general taxing powers, that the said Promissory Note and Lien Agreement is not private activity bonds as defined in Section 141 of the IRS Code, that at least 95 percent of the net proceeds of the said Promissory Note and Lien Agreement, (i.e. the proceeds of the said Promissory Note and Lien Agreement reduced by amounts in a reasonably required reserve or replacement fund, if any) will be used for local governmental activities of Lafayette County, and that the aggregate face amount of all tax-exempt obligations (other than private activity bonds as defined in Section 141

of the IRS Code), including the above said Promissory Note and Lien Agreement, issued by or on behalf of Lafayette County (and all subordinated entities thereof) during the 2013 calendar year is not reasonably expected to exceed \$5,000,000.00).

Section 5. Lafayette County desires to qualify the above referenced Promissory Note and Lien Agreement for the exception contained in Section 265(b) (3) of the IRS Code to the provisions contained in Section 265 (b) of the IRS Code which deny financial institutions any deduction for interest expense allocable to tax-exempt obligations acquired after August 7, 1986, and to designate the said Promissory Note and Lien Agreement for the purpose of qualifying for such exception; and the Board of County Commissioners does hereby find and determine that the aggregate face amount of all qualified tax-exempt obligations (excluding private activity bonds, as defined in Section 141 of the IRS Code, other than qualified 501(c) (3) bonds, as defined in Section 145 of the IRS Code), including the above said Promissory Note and Lien Agreement issued by or on behalf of Lafayette County, (and all subordinate entities thereof), during the 2013 calendar year is not expected to exceed \$10,000,000.00, and that as of the date hereof, no tax-exempt obligations issued or authorized to be issued by or on behalf of Lafayette County, (and all subordinate entities thereof), other than the above said Promissory Note and Lien Agreement, have been designated by Lafayette County for the purpose of qualifying for such exemption.

Section 6. For purposes of qualifying the above referenced Promissory Note and Lien Agreement as referenced above, for the exception contained in Section 265 (b) (3) of the IRS Code to the provisions of Section 265 (b) of the IRS Code which deny financial institutions any deduction for interest expense allocable to tax-exempt obligations acquired after August 7, 1986, Lafayette County hereby designates the above said Promissory Note and Lien Agreement for such exception.

Section 7. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.
