The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the commissioner's meeting room at the Courthouse in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Thomas E. Pridgeon, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner Jack Byrd, Dist. 4; Commissioner Earnest Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan.

### **PLANNING & ZONING BOARD MEETING**

#### **SPECIAL MINING PERMIT – SESSIONS**

The board reviewed a special mining permit for John Sessions for approval. Some citizens living near the property to be permitted voiced their concerns to the board regarding how their property would be affected should the permit be given. The board explained that Mr. Sessions also had to go through the Department of Environmental Protection and the Bureau of Mining to get approval. Mr. Chris Lyons asked if the property was in the 100 year flood plain, and Mr. Bobby Johnson looked that up and said that it was not. On a motion by Mr. Pridgeon and a second by Mr. Byrd, the board voted unanimously to recommend to the Board of County Commissioners for approval.

#### **RECESS PLANNING & ZONING BOARD MEETING**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Lamb, the board voted unanimously to recess the Planning & Zoning Board meeting.

#### **CALL THE REGULAR MEETING TO ORDER**

#### **APPROVE THE MINUTES**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

#### **TANSY ROAD FLOODING**

Residents living on Tansy Road addressed the board about the flooding on their road and the work that needs to be done to prevent this same problem during future flooding. This issue was continued from last meeting. The board informed the residents that FEMA stated that funding given for this project could only restore the road to its prior state and would not cover improvements to the road. The board said that they are

looking in to correcting this problem, but it will take time to get funding and also get the work completed. No action was taken on this issue.

**PUBLIC HEARING CPA 09-2 – REVELS**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Byrd, the board voted unanimously to have Ms. McMillan read CPA 09-3 by title only. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the board voted unanimously to recommend to the Board of County Commissioners for approval.

**ADJOURN THE PLANNING & ZONING BOARD MEETING**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the board voted unanimously to adjourn the Planning & Zoning Board meeting.

**RE-OPEN BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONER MEETING**

**SUNNY OAKS SUBDIVISION**

Mr. Hector Hernandez addressed the board about an animal complaint against him by one of his neighbors. On a motion by Mr. Pridgeon and a second by Mr. Jones, the board voted unanimously to table this issue until the next meeting to give Mr. Bobby Johnson and Mr. Pridgeon time to go to the Sunny Oaks Subdivision and check things out.

**BOBBY JOHNSON VACATION REQUEST**

Mr. Bobby Johnson requested to be off for vacation from July 11-July 18, 2009. The board approved his request to be off that week.

**SPECIAL MINING PERMIT – SESSIONS**

On a motion by Mr. Pridgeon and a second by Mr. Lamb, the board voted unanimously to approve a special mining permit for John Sessions.

**PUBLIC HEARING CPA 09-2 – REVELS**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the board voted unanimously to have Ms. McMillan read CPA 09-2 by title only. This is the first reading only, no action was taken at this time.

**PUBLIC HEARING CPA 09-1**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the board voted unanimously to have Ms. McMillan read CPA 09-1 by title only. This is the first reading only, no action was taken at this time.

**MAY BUILDING DEPARTMENT/SOLID WASTE REPORTS**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the board voted unanimously to approve the May Building Department/Solid Waste billing reports.

**APPROVE THE BILLS**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the board voted unanimously to approve the following bills, with the exception of the Paul Lamb bill:

General Fund - \$325,807.60

Emergency 911 Fund - \$641.54

Industrial Park - \$92.73

Special Law Enforcement Trust Fund - \$535.00

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, with Mr. Lamb abstaining, the board voted unanimously to approve the Paul Lamb bill in the amount of \$282.00.

**SPECIAL ASSESSMENT EXEMPTION REQUEST**

The board reviewed a letter from the heirs of Mildred Land requesting a special assessment exemption. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the board voted unanimously to exempt the penalties and interest, but the full special assessment amount is to be paid.

**EMS MATCHING GRANT**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the board voted unanimously to approve the EMS Matching Grant contingent upon finances being available for the grant.

**EMS PURCHASE ORDER REQUEST**

A purchase order request from the EMS Fund was submitted to the board for approval of the installation of an exhaust fan. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the board voted unanimously to table the issue for now.

**ENGINEERING SERVICES**

Bailey, Bishop & Lane submitted a pay request for engineering services at the Hardenbergh Boat Ramp. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones the board voted unanimously to table this issue for now pending a call from Bailey, Bishop & Lane to Mr. Hamlin.

**911 ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

The board discussed forming a 911 Advisory Committee consisting of Sheriff Lamb, Vicki Ducksworth, Donnie Land, Trevor Hicks, and one member from the County Commission. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Lamb, the board voted unanimously to form the committee and appoint Earnest Jones to serve as County Commission Board member.


**SHIP RESOLUTION**

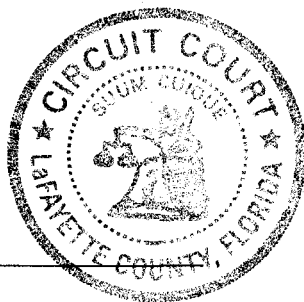



RESOLUTION NO. PZ/LPA CPA 09-2

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, SERVING AS THE PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA AND THE LOCAL PLANNING AGENCY OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, RECOMMENDING TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, APPROVAL OF AN AMENDMENT OF MORE THAN TEN ACRES OF LAND TO THE FUTURE LAND USE PLAN MAP OF THE LAFAYETTE COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, PURSUANT TO AN APPLICATION BY THE PROPERTY OWNERS OF SAID ACREAGE, UNDER THE AMENDMENT PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED IN SECTIONS 163.3161 THROUGH 163.3215, FLORIDA STATUTES, AS AMENDED, PROVIDING FOR CHANGING THE LAND USE CLASSIFICATION FROM RESIDENTIAL, LOW DENSITY (LESS THAN OR EQUAL TO 1 DWELLING UNIT PER ACRE) TO RESIDENTIAL, MODERATE DENSITY (LESS THAN OR EQUAL TO 2 DWELLING UNITS PER ACRE) OF CERTAIN LANDS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA; REPEALING ALL RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Lafayette County Land Development Regulations, as amended, hereinafter referred to as the Land Development Regulations, empowers the Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County, Florida, serving as the Planning and Zoning Board of Lafayette County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Planning and Zoning Board, to recommend to the Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the Board of County Commissioners, approval or denial of amendments to the Comprehensive Plan, in accordance with said regulations;

WHEREAS, Sections 163.3161 to 163.3215, Florida Statutes, as amended, the Local Government Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Regulation Act, empowers the Local Planning Agency of Lafayette County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the Local Planning Agency, to recommend to the Board of County Commissioners approval or denial of amendments to the Comprehensive Plan, in accordance with said statute;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has been designated as the Planning and Zoning Board;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has been designated as the Local Planning Agency;

WHEREAS, an application for an amendment, as described below, has been filed with the County;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Land Development Regulations and Section 163.3174, Florida Statutes, as amended, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Planning and Zoning Board and the Local Planning Agency, held the required public hearing, with public notice, on said application for an amendment, as described below, and considered all comments received during said public hearing and the Concurrency Management Assessment concerning said application for an amendment, as described below;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Planning and Zoning Board and the Local Planning Agency, has determined and found said application for an amendment, as described below, to be compatible with the Land Use Element objectives and policies, and those of other affected elements of the Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Planning and Zoning Board and the Local Planning Agency, has determined and found that approval of said application for an amendment, as described below, would promote the public health, safety, morals, order, comfort, convenience, appearance, prosperity or general welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, SERVING AS THE PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA AND THE LOCAL PLANNING AGENCY OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. Pursuant to an application, CPA 09-2, by JoAnna Lemon, as agent for Leon D. Revels, Jr and Billie T. Revels, to amend the Future Land Use Plan Map of the Comprehensive Plan by changing the future land use classification of certain lands, the Board of County Commissioners, serving as the Planning and Zoning Board and the Local Planning Agency, recommends to the Board of County Commissioners that the land use classification be changed from RESIDENTIAL, LOW DENSITY (less than or equal to 1 dwelling unit per acre) to RESIDENTIAL, MODERATE DENSITY (less than or equal to 2 dwelling units per acre) on property described, as follows:

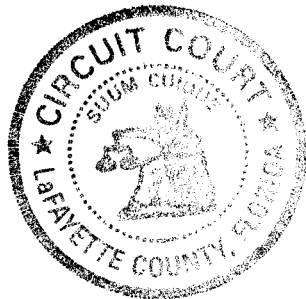
A parcel of land lying within Section 1, Township 5 South, Range 11 East, Lafayette County, Florida. Being more particularly described, as follows: Commence at the Northeast corner of the West 1/2 of the Southeast 1/4 of said Section 1; thence South 00°45'34" East, along the East line of the West 1/2 of the Southeast 1/4 of said Section 1, a distance of 1,892.47 feet; thence North 88°38'23" West 648.57 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence South 00°45'34" East 738.08 feet; thence North 88°25'25" West 795.01 feet to the Southeast corner of the West 1/2 of the Southeast 1/4 of said Section 1; thence North 88°25'25" West 520.57 feet to the Easterly right-of-way line of County Road 51; thence North 04°23'49" East, along the Easterly right-of-way line of said County Road 51, a distance of 1,094.62 feet; thence South 88°48'27" East 421.82 feet; thence South 00°46'09" East 361.95 feet; thence South 88°38'23" East 795.01 feet to the Point of Beginning.

Containing 25.28 acres, more or less.

Section 2. All resolutions or portions of resolutions in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 3. This resolution shall become effective upon adoption.

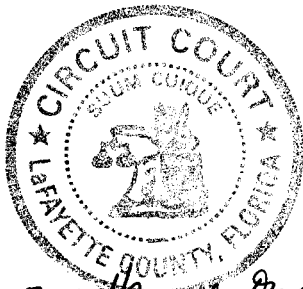
Now therefore, be it resolved by the County Commission of Lafayette County, Florida;

Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. For this reason, please pay close attention to the instructions on this form before completing the reverse side and filing the form.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 112.3143, FLORIDA STATUTES

A person holding elective or appointive county, municipal, or other local public office **MUST ABSTAIN** from voting on a measure which inures to his or her special private gain or loss. Each elected or appointed local officer also is prohibited from knowingly voting on a measure which inures to the special gain or loss of a principal (other than a government agency) by whom he or she is retained (including the parent organization or subsidiary of a corporate principal by which he or she is retained); to the special private gain or loss of a relative; or to the special private gain or loss of a business associate. Commissioners of community redevelopment agencies under Sec. 163.356 or 163.357, F.S., and officers of independent special tax districts elected on a one-acre, one-vote basis are not prohibited from voting in that capacity.

For purposes of this law, a "relative" includes only the officer's father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, and daughter-in-law. A "business associate" means any person or entity engaged in or carrying on a business enterprise with the officer as a partner, joint venturer, coowner of property, or corporate shareholder (where the shares of the corporation are not listed on any national or regional stock exchange).

In addition to abstaining from voting in the situations described above, you must disclose the conflict:

**PRIOR TO THE VOTE BEING TAKEN** by publicly stating to the assembly the nature of your interest in the measure on which you are abstaining from voting; *and*

**WITHIN 15 DAYS AFTER THE VOTE OCCURS** by completing and filing this form with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who should incorporate the form in the minutes.

### APPOINTED OFFICERS:

Although you must abstain from voting in the situations described above, you otherwise may participate in these matters. However, you must disclose the nature of the conflict before making any attempt to influence the decision, whether orally or in writing and whether made by you or at your direction.

**IF YOU INTEND TO MAKE ANY ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION PRIOR TO THE MEETING AT WHICH THE VOTE WILL BE TAKEN:**

- You must complete and file this form (before making any attempt to influence the decision) with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who will incorporate the form in the minutes. (Continued on other side)

**APPOINTED OFFICERS (continued)**

- A copy of the form must be provided immediately to the other members of the agency.
- The form must be read publicly at the next meeting after the form is filed.

- You must disclose orally the nature of your conflict in the measure before participating.
