The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Gail Garrard, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner T. Jack Byrd, Dist. 4; Commissioner Earnest L. Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan-Fredriksson.

#### **APPROVE THE MINUTES**

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

#### **LANA MORGAN, SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS**

Mrs. Lana Morgan-O'Steen, Lafayette County Supervisor of Elections, discussed with the Board a possibility of reapportionment in relation to the County Commission and School Board Districts. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to leave the districting as is (see attached).

#### **WATER SUPPLY MONITORING GROUP**

Mr. Bobby Johnson discussed the water supply monitoring group and the upcoming meeting being held. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to appoint Mr. Jack Byrd to the working group of the NFEDP to monitor water supply issues.

#### **PART TIME EMT APPLICATION**

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve Samantha Sands as a part time EMT for the EMS station.

#### **OPEN BIDS FOR CHAIN LINK FENCE AT EDWARD PERRY RECREATIONAL COMPLEX**

The following bids were submitted for a chain link fence at the Edward Perry Recreational Complex: Live Oak Management Group - \$15,196.80; Reliable Fence Company - \$6,614.00; C & F Services - \$9,891.00; Scott Savage -

\$8,350.63; and Florida Fence - \$9,286.00. On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to award the bid to Reliable Fence Company as the low bidder.

**ORDINANCE 2012-01 BOATING RESTRICTIONS ON THE SUWANNEE RIVER**

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to have Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson read Ordinance 2012-01 regarding boating restrictions on the Suwannee River by title only. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the Ordinance.

**TRANSFER 2010 FORD EXPLORER TO SUWANNEE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to transfer the 2010 Ford Explorer from the Lafayette County Health Department to the Suwannee County Health Department.

**APPROVE THE BILLS**

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Lamb, with the exception of the Byrd's Power Equipment bill, the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills:

General Fund - \$275,929.84

Courthouse Renovation Reserve Fund - \$21,898.33

Emergency 911 Fund - \$805.25

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, with Mr. Byrd abstaining, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Byrd's Power Equipment bill in the amount of \$145.86.

**DEBBIE BELCHER, GRANTS WRITER**

Mrs. Debbie Belcher discussed the contract on the Energy Efficient Grant with the Board and the bid that was submitted by Harlie Lynch Construction, Inc. The total amount on the contract is \$219,691.65. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Bid Modification for the Contract and to execute the contract.



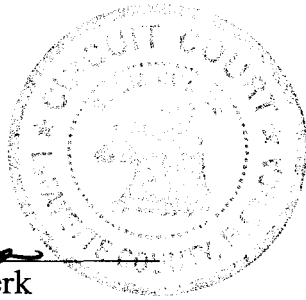

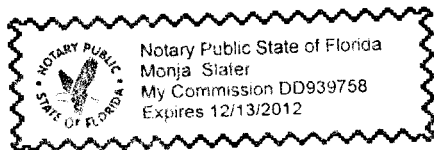

ORDINANCE

**AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO BOATING RESTRICTED  
AREAS ON THE SUWANNEE RIVER; PROVIDING FOR A  
PURPOSE, PROVIDING DEFINITIONS, ESTABLISHING  
BOATING RESTRICTED AREAS, PENALTIES and  
PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, excessive speed and wakes within congested areas of the Santa Fe river and Suwannee River can create hazards to human safety and create environmental damage; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 327.46, Florida statutes, authorizes counties to adopt restricted speed zones on water bodies within their jurisdiction; and

**WHEREAS**, the Lafayette County Board of County Commissioners finds it to be in the public interest to adopt the restricted speed zones set forth in this ordinance.

**THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

**SECTION 1. Purpose.** The purpose of this ordinance is to provide uniform regulations for the safe operation of motorboats and other vessels in or upon the waters within the jurisdiction of Lafayette County consistent with Chapters 125 and 327, Florida Statutes and Chapters 68D-21 and/or 68D-23, Florida Administrative Code.

**SECTION 2. Definitions.**

*Boating-restricted area* means an area of the waters of the state within which the operation of vessels is subject to specified restrictions or from which vessels are excluded.

*Motorboat* means any vessel equipped with machinery for propulsion, irrespective of whether the propulsion machinery is in actual operation.

*Operate* means to be in charge of or in command of or in actual physical control of a vessel upon the waters of this state, or to exercise control over or to have responsibility for a vessel's navigation or safety while the vessel is underway upon the waters of this state, or to control or steer a vessel being towed by another vessel upon the waters of the state.

*Person* means an individual, partnership, firm, corporation, association or other entity.

*Regulatory marker* means a device used to alert the mariner to various regulatory matters such as horsepower, speed, wake, or entry restrictions in conformity with the Uniform State Waterway Marking System and the United States Aids to Navigation System, Part 62 of Title 33 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

*Slow Speed* and *Slow Speed Minimum Wake* may be used interchangeably and mean that a vessel must be fully off plane and completely settled into the water. The vessel must then proceed at a speed which is reasonable and prudent under the prevailing circumstances so as to avoid the creation of an excessive wake or other hazardous condition which endangers or is likely to endanger other vessels or other persons using the waterway. At no time is any vessel required to proceed so slowly that the operator is unable to maintain control over the vessel or any other vessel or object that it has under tow. A vessel that is:

1. Operating on plane is not proceeding at this speed;
2. In the process of coming off plane and settling into the water or coming up onto plane is not proceeding at this speed;
3. Operating at a speed that creates a wake which unreasonably or unnecessarily endangers other vessels or other persons using the waterway, or is likely to do so, is not proceeding at this speed;
4. Completely off plane and fully settled into the water, and proceeding at a reasonable and prudent speed with little or no wake is proceeding at this speed.

*Vessel* is synonymous with boat as referenced in § 1(b), Art. VII of the State Constitution and includes every description of watercraft, barge, and airboat, other than a seaplane on the water, used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on water.

*Wake* means when used in conjunction with a numerical size limit, means all changes in the vertical height of the water's surface caused by the passage of a vessel including, but not limited to, a vessel's bow wave, stern wake, and propeller wash, measured from the ambient tide level to the crest of the vessel's wake at a distance of not less than 25 feet from the vessel.

**SECTION 3. *Area of enforcement.*** The areas of enforcement shall be all waters, creeks and canals located within the boundaries described below for the purpose necessary to protect the safety of the public as such restrictions are necessary based on boating accidents, visibility, hazardous currents or water levels, vessel traffic congestion, or other navigational hazards in compliance with Section 327.46, Florida Statutes.

Confluence of the Santa Fe and Suwannee Rivers, including the Butler Landing Boat Ramp - A Slow Speed Minimum Wake zone, shore to shore, within waters shared by Gilchrist, Lafayette and Suwannee Counties, bounded by the following three points:

1. A point 300-feet northeast of the Butler Landing Public Boat Ramp (upstream on the Santa Fe River),
2. A point 300-feet southwest of the confluence of the Santa Fe and Suwannee Rivers (downstream on the Suwannee River), and
3. A point 300-feet southeast of the confluence of the Santa Fe and Suwannee Rivers (upstream on the Suwannee River).

**SECTION 4. Posting Boating Restricted Markers.** Implementation of the boating restricted areas is contingent upon receiving all applicable state and/or federal authorizations to insure compliance with Chapter 68D-23, Florida Administrative Code and to assist in navigation consistent with the United States Aids to Navigation System.

**SECTION 5. Penalties.** The provisions of this section may be enforced by any law enforcement officer as defined in §.943.10, Florida Statutes.

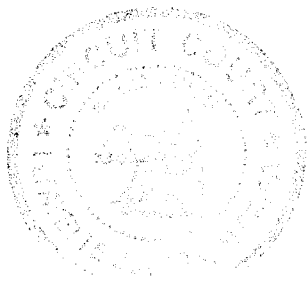
Pursuant to Section 327.73, Florida Statutes, any person cited for a violation of any such provision shall be deemed to be charged with a noncriminal infraction, shall be cited for such an infraction, and shall be cited to appear before the county court. The civil penalty for any such infraction is \$50, except as otherwise provided for allowable county court costs for boating infractions.

*References to other authorities.* Where a statute or administrative rules are referenced herein, this shall mean the most recently adopted version of said statute and administrative rules.

*Severability.* If any section, sentence, clause, or word of this section is for any reason declared to be unenforceable or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions shall not be affected.

**SECTION 6. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be effective upon completion of the following: approved and adopted pursuant to Lafayette County's procedure, approval by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission pursuant to Section 327.46, Florida Statutes and upon posting of the regulatory markers.

**WHO MUST FILE FORM 8B**

This form is for use by any person serving at the county, city, or other local level of government on an appointed or elected board, council, commission, authority, or committee. It applies equally to members of advisory and non-advisory bodies who are presented with a voting conflict of interest under Section 112.3143, Florida Statutes.

Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. For this reason, please pay close attention to the instructions on this form before completing the reverse side and filing the form.

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 112.3143, FLORIDA STATUTES**

A person holding elective or appointive county, municipal, or other local public office **MUST ABSTAIN** from voting on a measure which inures to his or her special private gain or loss. Each elected or appointed local officer also is prohibited from knowingly voting on a measure which inures to the special gain or loss of a principal (other than a government agency) by whom he or she is retained (including the parent organization or subsidiary of a corporate principal by which he or she is retained); to the special private gain or loss of a relative; or to the special private gain or loss of a business associate. Commissioners of community redevelopment agencies under Sec. 163.356 or 163.357, F.S., and officers of independent special tax districts elected on a one-acre, one-vote basis are not prohibited from voting in that capacity.

For purposes of this law, a "relative" includes only the officer's father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, and daughter-in-law. A "business associate" means any person or entity engaged in or carrying on a business enterprise with the officer as a partner, joint venturer, coowner of property, or corporate shareholder (where the shares of the corporation are not listed on any national or regional stock exchange).

**ELECTED OFFICERS:**

In addition to abstaining from voting in the situations described above, you must disclose the conflict:

**PRIOR TO THE VOTE BEING TAKEN** by publicly stating to the assembly the nature of your interest in the measure on which you are abstaining from voting; *and*

**WITHIN 15 DAYS AFTER THE VOTE OCCURS** by completing and filing this form with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who should incorporate the form in the minutes.

**APPOINTED OFFICERS:**

Although you must abstain from voting in the situations described above, you otherwise may participate in these matters. However, you must disclose the nature of the conflict before making any attempt to influence the decision, whether orally or in writing and whether made by you or at your direction.

**IF YOU INTEND TO MAKE ANY ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION PRIOR TO THE MEETING AT WHICH THE VOTE WILL BE TAKEN:**

- You must complete and file this form (before making any attempt to influence the decision) with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who will incorporate the form in the minutes. (Continued on other side)

**APPOINTED OFFICERS (continued)**

- A copy of the form must be provided immediately to the other members of the agency.
- The form must be read publicly at the next meeting after the form is filed.



