APPROVE THE MINUTES

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

The Department Heads gave their reports to the Board. No action was taken by the Board.

REQUEST FOR ACCUMULATED LEAVE

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to pay Cathy Musgrave for her accumulated sick and annual leave time.

RJH CONSTRUCTION AWARDED BID FOR JAIL RE-ROOF JOB

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to award the jail "re-roof" base bid to RJH Construction with changes made to some of the alternate bids by Robert Johnson. After the changes RJH Construction remained the low bidder.

SCRAP AND SCOP PROGRAMS

The Department of Transportation's SCRAP and SCOP programs were discussed. No action was taken on this issue.

SUWANNEE RIVER BEND INC. LOT OFFER TO COUNTY

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to accept Suwannee River Bend Inc. offer to deed Lots 39 and 39A to Lafayette County pending Jack Byrd's review and approval. The lots are in the Fourth District.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT HARDSHIP EXEMPTIONS

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve the attached Special Assessment exemption requests based on income. They were approved if they met the following guidelines:

- Annual salary of \$9500 for single occupancy
- Annual salary of \$11,500 for multiple occupancy

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve the attached list of exemption requests based on use. The status is noted on the attachment.

MUD-BOGGING ACTIVITIES

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously for Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson, County Attorney, to draft a proposed noise ordinance for the Board to review. Mr. Bobby Johnson was instructed to go to the Joyner Mud bogging site and review their compliance with the conditions of the Special Exception for the site. Mr. Johnson will report back at the next Board meeting with the results.

APPROVE THE BILLS

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills, with the exception of the Byrd's Power Equipment bill:

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Byrd's Power Equipment bill of \$93.31.

BELL WOODWORKS PAST DUE LEASE



A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, EXPRESSING ITS SUPPORT THAT THE DESIGNATION OF RURAL AREA OF CRITICAL ECONOMIC **CONCERN (RACEC) CONTINUE TO APPLY TO THE NORTH CENTRAL FLORIDA** REGION **INCORPORATING** BAKER, **BRADFORD**, COLUMBIA, DIXIE, HAMILTON. **GILCHRIST**, JEFFERSON, LAFAYETTE, LEVY, MADISON, PUTNAM, SUWANNEE, TAYLOR, AND **COUNTIES** (INCLUDING THE CITIES, **TOWNS UNION** AND **COMMUNITIES WITHIN EACH); AND, THAT ALL ENTERPRISE ZONES** IN THESE COUNTIES AND COMMUNITIES CONTINUE TO EXIST; AND THE CONTINUATION OF ALL STAFFING GRANT FUNDING FOR THE DEVELOPMENT NORTH FLORIDA **ECONOMIC** PARTNERSHIP (NFEDP) THROUGH FUNDS APPROPRIATED BY THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE AND ADMINISTERED **THROUGH FLORIDA'S** DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE NO LATER THAN JUNE 1, 2013.

WHEREAS, the North Florida Economic Development Partnership (NFEDP) was created as the regional organization work in cooperation with the 14 counties to promote and improve economic development throughout the North Central Florida region; and

WHEREAS, the various counties and municipalities in the NFEDP's region request that Governor Rick Scott renew the designation as a Rural Area of Critical Economic Concern; and

- 1. That the designation of the North Central Florida Rural Area of Critical Economic Concern (RACEC) continue to apply to Baker, Bradford, Columbia, Dixie, Gilchrist, Hamilton, Jefferson, Lafayette, Levy, Madison, Putnam, Suwannee, Taylor, and Union counties;
- 2. That all existing Enterprise Zones in these counties continue to exist; and
- 3. The continuation of all staffing grant funding be continued and expanded for the North Florida Economic Development Partnership (NFEDP) through funds appropriated by the Florida Legislature and administered through Florida's Department of Economic Development Opportunity, Enterprise Florida, Inc. and/or other designated agencies.


