REGULAR MEETING APRIL 8, 2013 9:00 A.M.

The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Gail Garrard, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner T. Jack Byrd, Dist, 4; Commissioner Earnest L. Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan-Fredriksson.

APPROVE THE MINUTES

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

AWARD BID FOR CDBG HOUSE

Mrs. Debbie Belcher gave the Board the bids that were turned in for Rika Starling's house. Mr. Dave Mowrey was the low bidder for this house. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to award the bid to Mr. Mowrey as the low bidder. (See attached bid tabulation sheet.)

FIRST RESPONDERS CLASS TEXTBOOKS

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to allow Mr. Trevor Hicks to purchase more textbooks for the First Responders Class. There were originally 8 people taking the class and now there are 20 who are going to be taking it.

BELL WOODWORKS

Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson discussed Bell Woodworks' past due rent with the Board. Mr. Bell said he would like to try again to catch up the payments, and would the Board be willing to work with him again. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to have Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson to draw up a new agreement with Bell Woodworks allowing him to add \$100.00 to the rent each month to get his payments current, but that there can't be anymore missed payments.

PUBLIC HEARING ON NOISE ORDINANCE

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to advertise the proposed noise ordinance for a public hearing.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT ORDINANCE

The Board discussed the Special Assessment Ordinance in regards to exemptions. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to table this issue for Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson to review and get back to them.

STREET NAMING ORDINANCE

The Board reviewed the Street Naming Ordinance for changes that need to be made for 911 purposes. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to allow Mr. Ricky Lyons, Mr. Brian Lamb, Mr. Donnie Land and Mr. Tim Walker to get with Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson to discuss changes that need to be made to the Ordinance. When changes are made, the Board will set it for a public hearing.

APPROVE THE BILLS

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Hamlin, with the exception of the Byrd's Power Equipment bill, the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills:

> General Fund - \$321,524.15 Emergency 911 Fund - \$49,391.05 Industrial Park Fund - \$2,660.21

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Hamlin, with Mr. Byrd abstaining, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Byrd's Power Equipment bill in the amount of \$195.07.

ADVERTISE FOR ROAD DEPARTMENT EQUIPMENT

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to advertise for bids for a new garbage truck.

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to advertise for bids for a new zero turn radius commercial mower.

AUTHORIZE PAYMENT OF MEDICAID BILL

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to authorize the Clerk's Office to pay the monthly Medicaid bill through Electronic Funds Transfers.

REQUEST FOR WAIVER OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

The Board reviewed and discussed a request from Gary Kristof for waiver of his special assessments. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to waive one year of his special assessments (2011-2012) because his power records were checked and during 2012 only 2 hours of service was used.

MUD BOGGING PROPERTY

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to post a cease of operations after petitioning the Judge for an order on mud bogging at Chris Joyner's property. This is due to his disregard of the Board of Adjustment's instructions at the last meeting to cease holding mud bogs until he corrects the violations of his temporary special exception and appeals the Board of Adjustment's decision to the County Commission.

VIVA FLORIDA RESOLUTION

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to have Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson prepare a VIVA Florida Resolution and authorize Mr. Lamb to sign.

ADJOURN

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to adjourn.
