The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner T. Jack Byrd, Dist. 4; Commissioner Earnest L. Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan-Fredriksson.

APPROVE THE MINUTES

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

DAY VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

Mr. Marvin Buchanan discussed the Day Volunteer Fire Department with the Board. Mr. Buchanan requested help from the Board in getting a facility built for the Volunteer Fire Department. The Board agreed to talk with County Engineer Will Rutherford about drawing up a plan for a new building and to discuss this further at a later meeting. No action was taken on this issue.

CHIPPER FOR THE ROAD DEPARTMENT

Mr. Scott Sadler discussed the Chipper at the Road Department, it is 11 years old and needs repairs. Mr. Sadler obtained a quote for repair from Flagler in the amount of \$6,500.00. He also got quotes for a new chipper from Flagler - \$28,499.00 and Vemeer - \$37,900.00. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve purchasing a new Chipper, and for going with the quote from Flagler as the low bid and to approve the first payment on the chipper. There will be three payments made over a two year period. All of the above quotes are from the Florida State Bid List.

LETTER OF APPRECIATION TO FRANK GARRARD

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to send Mr. Frank Garrard a letter of appreciation and a check in the amount of \$260.00 to recognize him for teaching the safety courses at the Public Works Department.

GUY NIEBRUEGGE – REQUEST TO WAIVE SPECIAL ASSESSMENT FEE

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to allow Mr. Niebruegge to pay \$2,352.00 for his past due special assessments which is the principal and 25% of the interest if it is paid immediately, 75% of the interest will be waived. Mr. Niebruegge stated that he will pay this amount in full the next day. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to have Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson draw up a policy dealing with future delinquent assessments.

OPEN BIDS FOR SURPLUS EQUIPMENT

The Board opened sealed bids for surplus equipment that belongs to the Road Department and the Library. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to award the bids to James Lawson, bid amount \$600.00, for the 1979 Ford F250, and Tresa Jackson, bid amount \$460.00, for the 1997 Ford Aerostar van, as the sole bidders.

REQUEST FOR CHANGE TO ROLLING HILLS SUBDIVISION PLAT

Mrs. Leenette McMillan-Fredriksson discussed a request for a change to the Rolling Hills subdivision plat by Dean Hendricks. He wants two lots (9 and 10) that are vacant to be removed from the subdivision plat and added to his property. This has to be advertised before any changes can be made. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to have Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson go ahead and advertise this for a public hearing.

APPROVE THE BILLS

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, with the exception of the Paul Lamb bill, the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills:

General Fund - \$76,352.92 Industrial Park Fund - \$59.14 Emergency 911 Fund - \$3,625.00 Courthouse Renovation Reserve Fund - \$14,901.04 Road & Bridge Secondary Fund - \$274,092.09 Capital Projects Fund - \$1,699.95

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, with Mr. Lamb abstaining, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Paul Lamb bill in the amount of \$282.00.

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve a change order request for the EOC/Dental Clinic in the amount of \$7,186.28.

LETTER OF REQUEST FROM SHERIFF'S OFFICE

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve a letter of request from the Sheriff's Office to keep the remaining amount of \$20,084.68 in his budget from the last fiscal year. These funds will be used toward the 9-1-1 renovation.

AMENDMENT TO BUSNESS TAX ORDINANCE

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to advertise to amend the existing Ordinance regarding business taxes. The amendment would still register businesses but no longer charge for the license.

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to adjourn.
