

REGULAR MEETING  
MARCH 14, 2011

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The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Gail Garrard, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner T. Jack Byrd, Dist. 4; Commissioner Earnest Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan-Fredriksson.

**APPROVE THE MINUTES**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

**REQUEST TO TRANSFER PERMIT**

Ms. Anna Laura Hall requested to transfer her mobile home permit to her camper adjacent to her home. On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve her request.

**RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING JOHN KOCH**

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to have Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson read a Resolution recognizing John Koch. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Resolution and presented it to Mr. Koch for his services of providing the news for Lafayette County.

**DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH 2011-2012 BUSINESS PLAN**

Mrs. Pam Blackman, with the Department of Health, discussed the 2011-2012 Business Plan with the Board. No action was taken on this issue.

**CULVERT – FFA CHAPTER**

Mr. Michael Frier discussed the installation of a culvert on US 27 for the FFA chapter. On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve installing the culvert.

**DONNIE LAND – PUBLIC SAFETY/INDUSTRIAL PARK**

Mr. Donnie Land discussed the following issues with the Board: Rescue 3 is ready for service; requested to hire Rita Woodfaulk as a paramedic and on a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve hiring Ms. Woodfaulk; requested to use Charlie Conner on the weekends if needed, this request was not approved by the Board; discussed Mr. Alton Scott participating in State Emergency Management seminars; and requested permission from the Board to remove the fence in the parking area at the Bass Assassins building, the Board approved this request upon general consent.

**REQUEST FOR SPECIAL ASSESSMENT EXEMPTION BY MRS. WILSON**

Mr. Bobby Johnson discussed the special assessment exemption request by Mrs. Wilson for her property. She currently has 3 RV's and a mobile home connected to power on her property. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to charge her for 4 campsites.

**RETIREMENT PAYMENT FOR BOBBY JOHNSON**

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to approve a payment in the amount of \$13,439.80 to the Division of Retirement for Mr. Bobby Johnson's retirement retroactive back to when his position changed to senior management.

**HARDENBERGH BOAT RAMP**

The Board opened sealed bids for a port-a-potty at the Hardenbergh Boat Ramp. The following bid was received: Stephenson Septic Tanks - \$12,297.80. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to have Mr. Phil Bishop review this bid and report back at the next meeting. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve a payment request by Ben Withers, Inc. in the amount of \$31,572.00. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve the change order for adding 2 benches at the boat ramp.

**EZELL LANDING BOAT RAMP RESOLUTION**

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to have Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson read the Ezell Landing Boat Ramp Resolution. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Resolution applying for a grant to improve the Boat Ramp.

**HURST LANDING BOAT RAMP RESOLUTION**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to have Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson read the Hurst Landing Boat Ramp Resolution. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Resolution applying for a grant to improve the Boat Ramp.

**APPOINT A MEMBER TO THE DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY BOARD**

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to appoint Mr. Al Scott to the Development Authority Board.

**ADOPT A RESOLUTION DECLARING APRIL AS WATER CONSERVATION MONTH**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to have Mr. Lyons read a Resolution declaring April as Water Conservation Month. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Resolution.

**APPROVE THE BILLS**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, with the exception of the Byrd's Equipment bill and the Paul Lamb bill, the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills:

Capital Projects Fund - \$1,144.29

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mrs. Garrard, with Mr. Byrd abstaining, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Byrd's Power Equipment bill in the amount of \$79.07. On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, with Mr. Lamb abstaining, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Paul Lamb bill in the amount of \$282.00.

**PROPOSAL TO LEASE OLD DENTAL CLINIC BUILDING**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to lease the old Dental Clinic Building to Doctor's Memorial, Mrs. McMillan-Fredriksson will draw up the contract.

**DEBBIE BELCHER, GRANTS WRITER**

Mrs. Debbie Belcher discussed applying for a Housing CDBG Grant with the Board. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to have Mrs. Belcher to begin the process to apply for the grant.

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve the February Building Department/Solid Waste billing reports.



**WHEREAS**, the Lafayette County Commission is committed to setting a good example for its citizens regarding water conservation; and


**WHEREAS**, every business, industry, school and citizen can make a difference when it comes to conserving water;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Earnest L. Jones, Chairman of the Lafayette County Commission, Florida, do hereby proclaim April 2011, as



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Dear County Commissioners:

This letter is to inform you of the budget projections we are facing in the near future. We are currently receiving several grants that help fund salaries and maintenance on equipment. I have been informed that these grants may cease for next year's budget. I wanted to officially inform you of the hardships we may be encountering. Below is a breakdown of the anticipated grant funds we may be losing.

Byrne Grant (1 deputies salary)	\$34,000.00
Cops Grant (SMARTCOP software & hardware maintenance)	\$33,900.00
Total:	\$67,900.00

Also we may be facing an overage on our fuel budget. Our fuel budget is currently set at \$41,000.00 for this fiscal year. When our fuel budget was figured in 2009-2010 gas was approximately \$2.50 a gallon. As you are well aware fuel prices have steadily increased with the average today being approximately \$3.59 a gallon. While we are taking drastic measures to conserve fuel, our call volume has steadily increased. In fact, as of today we have received over 1,641 calls for service since January 1, 2011.

While economic hardships will be affecting all aspects of the county budget I want to try and stay on top of any changes we may be anticipating so that we can all work together and find a solution to maintain the level of service that the citizens of Lafayette County are accustomed to.
