The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Gail Garrard, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner T. Jack Byrd, Dist. 4; Commissioner Earnest L. Jones, Dist. 5; and Leenette McMillan-Fredriksson, County Attorney.

### **APPROVE THE MINUTES**

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

### **FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION WORK PLAN**

Mr. Jordan Green, with the Florida Department of Transportation discussed the Work Plan with the Board. No action was taken on this issue.

### **REQUEST TO TRANSFER SICK LEAVE**

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve a request from Mr. Scott Sadler to transfer 40 hours of sick leave from Dale Thacker to Wynona Thacker.

### **NEW HOPE BAPTIST CHURCH PROPERTY**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve having a title search and survey done on the old New Hope Baptist Church property, and to have Lynch Construction do the demolition work on the property.

### **HATCHBEND VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT**

The Board discussed a Notice of Violation that it received from the State of Florida which stated that the Board would receive a penalty for violations at the Hatchbend Volunteer Fire Department. The penalty would be \$1,000 per violation committed per day until the issue is resolved. On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted the following way to cease operations with the Hatchbend Volunteer Fire Department and request the Sheriff to not

dispatch calls to them until they become certified, and to use Suwannee County and Dixie County as back-up: Lamb – no; Garrard – yes; Hamlin – yes; Byrd – no; and Jones – no. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted the following way to postpone this issue until after Rep. Beshears meets with the Department of Financial Services on November 19, 2014: Lamb – yes; Garrard – no; Hamlin – no; Byrd – yes; and Jones – yes.

**2014-15 FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH MERIDIAN HEALTHCARE**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the 2014-15 funding agreement with Meridian Healthcare, and to appoint Becky Sharpe to fill the vacant seat.

**DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FUNDING AGREEMENT**

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve a funding agreement with the Department of Transportation transferring \$50,000 from the CR 300 project to the Shady Oaks project.

**HEALTHIEST WEIGHT FLORIDA INITIATIVE RESOLUTION**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to adopt a resolution in favor of the Healthiest Weight Florida Initiative.

**LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR THE FLORIDA TOURISM TASK FORCE**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to approve sending a letter of support for the Original Florida Tourism Task Force.

**LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR MADISON COUNTY**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to approve sending a letter of support to Madison County for their multi-purpose building.

**SE EDWARDS DRIVE**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve the repairs and resolution agreement with regard to



property on SE Edwards Drive. A ditch was dug on the subject property to divert water from homeowners during the 2014 flood.

**APPROVE THE BILLS**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Hamlin, with the exception of the Byrd's Power Equipment bill, the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills:

General Fund - \$423,773.27

Courthouse Renovation Reserve Fund - \$285,510.67

Emergency 911 Fund - \$809.73

Industrial Park Fund - \$16.41

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Jones, with Mr. Byrd abstaining, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Byrd's Power Equipment bill in the amount of \$105.60.

**SHERIFF'S BUDGET**

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mrs. Garrard, the Board voted unanimously to approve carrying forward the funds from the Sheriff's 2013-2014 budget in to the Sheriff's account that will be used for capital expenditures.

**ADJOURN**

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to adjourn to the grand opening of the Public Works Building.



**FUNDING AGREEMENT FOR THE PROVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH AND  
SUBSTANCE USE SERVICES**

**THIS AGREEMENT** entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_, by and between the **Board of County Commissioners of Lafayette County**, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission" and **Meridian Behavioral Healthcare, Inc.**, an independent contractor, hereinafter referred to as "MBH."

For and in consideration of the mutual undertaking and agreements hereinafter set forth, the Commission and MBH agree as follows:

1. The Commission Agrees:

A. To provide funds to MBH consistent with the requirements of Florida Statute (§394.76) for the provision of general mental health and substance use services, including Lafayette Act services to the citizens of Lafayette County in the amount of \$12,000.00. This sum is for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014 and ending September 30, 2015, and the Commission's allocation to operate the program and facilities for services for citizens of Lafayette County.

B. To release such funds in the amount of \$3,000.00 per quarter, upon receipt of an invoice due on the first day of each quarter.

2. MBH Agrees:

A. To provide mental health and substance use services, including Lafayette Act services to the citizens of Lafayette County.

B. To provide services to any person and ensure that no service will be denied and/or delayed to any person because of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, age or ability to pay.

C. To ensure that all information regarding clients be safeguarded in accordance with 45 C.F.R. § 205.50, and 42 C.F.R..

D. To comply with the provisions contained in the Civil Rights Certificate.

E. To provide, monitor, evaluate, and audit all programs funded under the terms of this agreement according to Federal and C&F guidelines, rules, regulations, instructions, and the approved C&F Plan.

F. Any funds expended in violation of this agreement or in violation of appropriate Federal and State requirements, or any funds claimed by MBH which are determined by the Commission to be in violation of appropriate departmental or federal guidelines shall be



refunded in full to the Commission or if this agreement is still in force, shall be withheld by the Commission from any subsequent compensation request.

G. To retain all fiscal and client books, records, or other documents relative to this agreement for seven (7) years after final payments or until audit or resolution of audit findings by county auditors.

H. To provide an opportunity for recipients of services to present their views about the service program and also establish a system through which clients may present reasonable grievances about the delivery of services under this Agreement. Such system shall include a provision for fair hearing.

I. To negotiate sub-agreements and be responsible for the execution of sub-agreements pursuant to this agreement. Such sub-agreements may be reviewed by the Commission and if they are found not to be in compliance with the provisions of this agreement, they shall be subject to revision by MBH, or funds may be withheld by the Commission.

3. MBH and the Commission Mutually Agree:

A. This Agreement shall begin on October 1, 2014 at 12:01 a.m. and end on September 30, 2015 at midnight.

B. This Agreement, or any part of this Agreement, may be terminated with or without cause, by either party, at any time, upon no less than thirty (30) days' notice in writing to the other party. Said notice shall be delivered by certified mail, telegram or in person.

C. Any alterations, variation, modification and/or waivers of provisions of this agreement shall be valid only when they have been reduced to writing, duly signed by all parties to the Agreement, and attached to the original Agreement.


D. This Agreement contains all terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties. No other agreements, oral or otherwise regarding the subject matter of this Agreement shall be deemed to exist or to bind any of the parties hereto.

This Notice of Violation is provided as an opportunity to give your department time to abate or correct all violations set forth herein. If all violations have not been abated or corrected within the allotted time, a Notice of Assessment of Penalties will be issued or other administrative action taken which shall constitute final agency action and which will contain a statement of your rights under Chapter 120, F.S., the Administrative Procedure Act.

A Notice of Inspection of Hatchbend Volunteer Fire Department was scheduled for OCTOBER 21, 2014. The scheduled inspection was not completed because the Hatchbend Volunteer Fire Department refused to allow entry to the Fire Marshal inspector. Therefore the following violations were noted:

You have 30 days from the receipt of this Notice of Violation to abate these violations. Abatement includes remediation and/or correction. If you have not abated all violations within the 30 day period, the State Fire Marshal will have no alternative but to issue a Notice of Assessment of Penalties assessing appropriate daily fines until all violations are abated, or to take such other action as may be permitted by law.

Once you have notified this bureau that you have abated or corrected all violations, the State Fire Marshal will schedule a re-inspection. Upon confirmation that all violations have been abated, an abatement notice will be placed in the State Fire Marshal's file.

You are encouraged, but not required, to contact this office and establish a schedule for abatement as soon as possible.

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-11-1-3

**A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE HEALTHIEST WEIGHT FLORIDA INITIATIVE**

**WHEREAS**, Lafayette County supports policies that focus on healthy weight, health and wellness, and healthier lifestyles in all communities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Florida Department of Health has launched a healthy weight campaign known as "Healthiest Weight Florida", a public-private collaboration to help Florida's children and adults make informed, consistent choices about healthy eating and active living; this program has been embraced by individuals and businesses in many cities, counties, and communities; and

**WHEREAS**, the State Surgeon General has launched the 2015 Healthy Weight Community Champion Recognition Program that will recognize local governments and active municipalities (cities, towns and villages) and 67 counties that implement policies to help people become more physically active and improve nutrition; Best practice policies implemented by communities will be recognized on January 5, 2015; and

**WHEREAS**, more than 73% of adults in Lafayette County are estimated to be overweight or obese and more than 43% of middle and high school students are overweight or obese; and

**WHEREAS**, more than 70% of Lafayette County adults do not consume at least 5 servings of fruits and vegetables daily and less than 70% of adults in Lafayette County are engaged in vigorous physical activity; and

**WHEREAS**, poor nutritional choices and lack of physical activity are linked to overweight and obesity which increase the risk of diabetes, cancer, heart disease, liver disease, hypertension and other health conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, several residents have just completed the 12-week "Biggest Loser Lafayette" campaign, a weight loss competition launched by DOH-Lafayette and supported by the Lafayette Health Improvement Partnership (LHIP); and
