#### APPROVE THE MINUTES

On a motion by Mrs. Garrard and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

#### FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION WORK PLAN

Mr. Jordan Green, with the Florida Department of Transportation discussed the Work Plan with the Board. No action was taken on this issue.

#### REQUEST TO TRANSFER SICK LEAVE

On a motion by Mr. Hamlin and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve a request from Mr. Scott Sadler to transfer 40 hours of sick leave from Dale Thacker to Wynona Thacker.

#### NEW HOPE BAPTIST CHURCH PROPERTY

On a motion by Mr. Byrd and a second by Mr. Hamlin, the Board voted unanimously to approve having a title search and survey done on the old New Hope Baptist Church property, and to have Lynch Construction do the demolition work on the property.

#### HATCHBEND VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Board discussed a Notice of Violation that it received from the State of Florida which stated that the Board would receive a penalty for violations at the Hatchbend Volunteer Fire Department. The penalty would be \$1,000 per violation committed per day until the issue is resolved. - F. Any funds expended in violation of this agreement or in violation of appropriate Federal and State requirements, or any funds claimed by MBH which are determined by the Commission to be in violation of appropriate departmental or federal guidelines shall be

refunded in full to the Commission or if this agreement is still in force, shall be withheld by the Commission from any subsequent compensation request.

- G. To retain all fiscal and client books, records, or other documents relative to this agreement for seven (7) years after final payments or until audit or resolution of audit findings by county auditors.
- H. To provide an opportunity for recipients of services to present their views about the service program and also establish a system through which clients may present reasonable grievances about the delivery of services under this Agreement. Such system shall include a provision for fail hearing.
- I. To negotiate sub-agreements and be responsible for the execution of sub-agreements pursuant to this agreement. Such sub-agreements may be reviewed by the Commission and if they are found not to be in compliance with the provisions of this agreement, they shall be subject to revision by MBH, or funds may be withheld by the Commission.

## RESOLUTION NO. <u>2014-//-/3</u>

#### A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE HEALTHIEST WEIGHT FLORIDA INITIATIVE

WHEREAS, Lafayette County supports policies that focus on healthy weight, health and wellness, and healthier lifestyles in all communities; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Health has launched a healthy weight campaign known as "Healthiest Weight Florida", a public-private collaboration to help Florida's children and adults make informed, consistent choices about healthy eating and active living; this program has been embraced by individuals and businesses in many cities, counties, and communities; and

WHEREAS, the State Surgeon General has launched the 2015 Healthy Weight Community Champion Recognition Program that will recognize local governments and active municipalities (cities, towns and villages) and 67 counties that implement policies to help people become more physically active and improve nutrition; Best practice policies implemented by communities will be recognized on January 5, 2015; and

WHEREAS, more than 73% of adults in Lafayette County are estimated to be overweight or obese and more than 43% of middle and high school students are overweight or obese; and

WHEREAS, more than 70% of Lafayette County adults do not consume at least 5 servings of fruits and vegetables daily and less than 70% of adults in Lafayette County are engaged in vigorous physical activity; and

WHEREAS, poor nutritional choices and lack of physical activity are linked to overweight and obesity which increase the risk of diabetes, cancer, heart disease, liver disease, hypertension and other health conditions; and

WHEREAS, several residents have just completed the 12-week "Biggest Loser Lafayette" campaign, a weight loss competition launched by DOH-Lafayette and supported by the Lafayette Health Improvement Partnership (LHIP); and

WHEREAS, county officials believe there are important, long-term community benefits to be gained by encouraging healthy lifestyles, including a decrease in overweight and obesity in Florida's adults and children and the associated negative health related impacts; and

WHEREAS, counties and community partners can work together to ensure that there are safe places for residents to be active, such as in parks, ball fields, pools, gyms, and recreation centers; and

WHEREAS, access to healthy foods has a direct impact on the overall health of our community and planning for fresh food, open space, sidewalks, and parks should be a priority.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA desire to participate in the Healthy Weight Community Champion Recognition 2015 Program and challenge all local governments, businesses, students, parents and all residents to participate in the Healthy Weight Florida campaign to foster healthy weight and improve overall health, improve job and school performance and decrease work and school absenteeism.
