The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Thomas E. Pridgeon, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner T. Jack Byrd, Dist. 4; Commissioner Earnest Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan.

APPROVE THE MINUTES

On a motion by Mr. Pridgeon and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

R.O. RANCH PROJECT

Mr. David Still, Executive Director with the Suwannee River Water Management District, approached the Board to request a variance on a site plan for the R.O. Ranch. The site plan contains 30 parking places for the whole project. To get a C.O. from the Building Department for the Welcome Center a variance was needed to complete the 11 parking places for that building. The remaining spaces will be completed with the rest of the project. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the request was granted unanimously.

OCTOBER BUILDING DEPARTMENT AND SOLID WASTE REPORTS

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Byrd, the Board voted unanimously to approve the October Building Department and Solid Waste reports.

ANNUAL DENTAL CLINIC FEE SCHEDULE



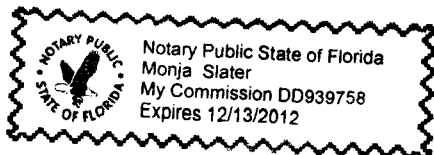

AN ORDINANCE OF THE LAFAYETTE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROVIDING RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING FOR-PROFIT VENDORS IN LAFAYETTE COUNTY PARKS.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

1. IN ORDER TO PROMOTE THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, A FOR-PROFIT VENDOR MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE IS HEREBY ENACTED.
2. FOR-PROFIT VENDORS MAY BE ALLOWED TO OPERATE IN OR ON COUNTY PARK PROPERTY, EXCEPT WHEN THE COUNTY PARK CONCESSION STAND IS OPEN FOR BUSINESS.
3. PRIOR TO A VENDOR OPERATING FOR-PROFIT, A VENDOR MUST COMPLETE AN APPLICATION PROVIDED BY THE COUNTY AND CONFORM TO ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SAID APPLICATION.
4. THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MAY AMEND THIS ORDINANCE BY RESOLUTION.
5. SEVERABILITY: IF ANY WORD, PHRASE OR CLAUSE OF THIS ORDINANCE IS FOUND TO BE INVALID OR UNCONSTITUTIONAL BY A COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION, SUCH PORTION OR WORDS SHALL BE DEEMED A SEPARATE AND INDEPENDENT PROVISION AND SUCH HOLDING SHALL NOT AFFECT THE VALIDITY OF THE REMAINING PORTIONS THEREOF.
6. CONFLICT: ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE ARE HEREBY REPEALED TO THE EXTENT OF THE CONFLICT. SEE ORDINANCE NO. 99-6, AND OTHER ORDINANCES AS APPLICABLE.
7. EFFECTIVE DATE: THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY UPON RECEIPT OF OFFICIAL ACKNOWLEDGMENT FROM THE OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE OF FLORIDA THAT THIS ORDINANCE HAS BEEN FILED IN SAID OFFICE.

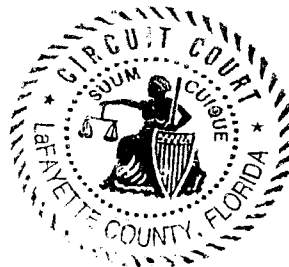

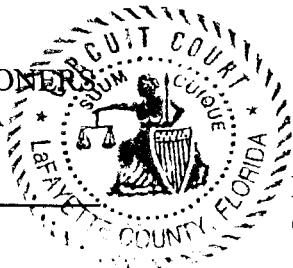
NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

1. IN ORDER TO PROMOTE THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, A PRIMITIVE CAMPING ORDINANCE IS HEREBY ENACTED.
2. PRIMITIVE CAMPING IN COUNTY PARKS IS PERMITTED, BUT LIMITED.
3. ORGANIZED GROUPS MAY RECEIVE PERMISSION FOR AN OVERNIGHT CAMPING PERMIT AT A SPECIFIED SITE IN A PARK WHERE SUCH DESIGNATED FACILITIES ARE AVAILABLE. PERMITS FOR OVERNIGHT CAMPING WILL BE ISSUED IN WRITING BY A BOARD DESIGNATED PERSON. PERMITS WILL BE ISSUED UNDER SUCH SPECIAL REGULATIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS AS MAY BE PRESCRIBED BY THE BOARD.
4. BRINING INTO A PARK AND USING FOR OVERNIGHT OCCUPANCY ANY HOUSE TRAILER, CAMP TRAILER, CAMP WAGON OR ANY OTHER FORM OF MOVABLE STRUCTURE OR SPECIAL VEHICLE IS PROHIBITED.
5. THERE SHALL BE NO PERMIT REQUIRED FOR ONE NIGHT ONLY OF PRIMITIVE CAMPING FOR ORGANIZED GROUPS.
6. SEVERABILITY: IF ANY WORD, PHRASE OR CLAUSE OF THIS ORDINANCE IS FOUND TO BE INVALID OR UNCONSTITUTIONAL BY A COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION, SUCH PORTION OR WORDS SHALL BE DEEMED A SEPARATE AND INDEPENDENT PROVISION AND SUCH HOLDING SHALL NOT AFFECT THE VALIDITY OF THE REMAINING PORTIONS THEREOF.
7. CONFLICT: ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE ARE HEREBY REPEALED TO THE EXTENT OF THE CONFLICT. SEE ORDINANCE NO. 99-6, AND OTHER ORDINANCES AS APPLICABLE.
8. PENALTIES: ANY PERSON VIOLATING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE MAY BE PROSECUTED IN THE SAME MANNER AS MISDEMEANORS ARE PROSECUTED. SUCH VIOLATORS UPON CONVICTION SHALL BE PUNISHED BY A FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$500.00 AND/OR IMPRISONMENT OF UP TO 60 DAYS IN THE COUNTY JAIL.
8. THIS ORDINANCE MAY BE AMENDED BY RESOLUTION OF BOARD.
9. EFFECTIVE DATE: THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY UPON RECEIPT OF OFFICIAL ACKNOWLEDGMENT FROM THE OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE OF FLORIDA THAT THIS ORDINANCE HAS BEEN FILED IN SAID OFFICE.

READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING BELOW.**

Vendors are subject to the following rules & regulations:

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Rental of a park space entitles the vendor to the use of a specific site or facility for the dates and times indicated on the special event application.**

2. Beer or alcoholic beverages are not permitted in Parks and/or buildings.
3. Renter is responsible for the conduct of all persons in the group.
4. The facility reserved is subject to inspection by an authorized Lafayette County representative.
5. Vendor must be completely self-contained and must provide their own water, drainage and electricity. Vending privilege will be terminated upon violation of this provision and vendor will be charged a use fee that will be deducted from the security deposit.
6. Renter agrees to leave the facility or site clean and orderly, and assumes personal liability for the cost of any repairs, damage, excessive clean up, loss, breakage, or removal of Park property.
7. Failure to comply with any portion of this application will result in forfeiture of all or part of the security deposit and, if necessary, Vendor will be billed for any additional amounts deemed appropriate.
8. The Vendor agrees to hold harmless and indemnify Lafayette County, its officers, agents and employees from and against all claims of any person for responsibility and/or liability for any damage, injury or loss sustained by persons or property as a result of or arising from the Renter's (including its members, agents employees, or invitees) activities or negligence.
9. Vendor agrees to submit to a criminal background check at vendor's expense.
10. The Board of County Commissioners reserves the right to cancel all reservations.
11. Florida Statute 856.011 is hereby adopted and incorporated in this Code by reference.

The Board of County Commissioners may waive any rules/regulations by application for a good cause.

ADDITIONAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR LAFAYETTE COUNTY PARKS

1. It shall be unlawful for any person:
 - a. To park vehicles in any County Park except in designated areas.
 - b. To light a fire in any County Park, except in designated fixtures
 - c. To set off fireworks in any County Park
 - d. To drive a motor vehicle in any County Park other than on areas provided for motor vehicles.
 - e. To have firearms in the park.
 - g. To camp overnight in any County Park.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, or to offer for sale to any person, any product; except a mobile vendor with the proper permits from Lafayette County Health Department may sell food and nonalcoholic beverages for immediate consumption by person in attendance at any County Park.

CLEAN-UP PROCEDURES

Clean-up must be completed by the end of the stated rental time, and the facility must be completely vacated.

In order to have your security deposit refunded, the grounds must be left in the same condition as they were found.

Clean-up consists of the renter and/or designees completing the following:

- 1) All debris must be placed in trash bags.**

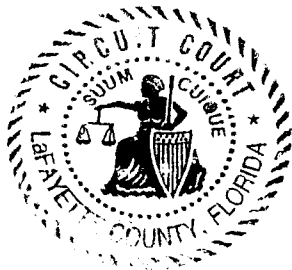
