

REGULAR MEETING
OCTOBER 11, 2010
9:00 A.M.

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The Lafayette County Commission met on the above date and hour for a regular scheduled meeting. The meeting was held in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room in Mayo, Florida. The following members were present: Commissioner Lance Lamb, Dist. 1; Commissioner Thomas E. Pridgeon, Dist. 2; Commissioner Donnie Hamlin, Dist. 3; Commissioner Earnest Jones, Dist. 5; and Lafayette County Attorney Leenette McMillan.

APPROVE THE MINUTES

On a motion by Mr. Pridgeon and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

PART TIME CUSTODIAN FOR THE COURTHOUSE

The Board discussed the applications for the Part Time Custodian position for the Courthouse. The Board agreed to have Mr. Bobby Johnson, as the Department Head, interview all of the applicants and make a recommendation to the Board for hiring.

PARK ORDINANCE AND POTENTIAL AMENDMENTS

The Board discussed the Park Ordinance and potential amendments to the Ordinance with Ms. McMillan. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the Board voted unanimously to set this for a public hearing at the next County Commission meeting.

DESIGNATE MEMBERS TO THE VALUE ADJUSTMENT BOARD

Mr. Lamb and Mr. Pridgeon volunteered to serve as County Commission members on the Value Adjustment Board, and on a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to appoint Jerry Walmeyer as the citizen to serve on the Board.

SECRETARY AT THE COUNTY EXTENSION OFFICE

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve hiring Brandy Barclay as Secretary at the County Extension Office, per the recommendation of Ms. Jana Hart.

RIVER RENDEZVOUS

The Board discussed an extension of the Special Exception for additional campsites at the River Rendezvous. The Board agreed to have a workshop with Mr. and Mrs. Page on October 25, 2010 at 4:00 p.m. preceding the next County Commission meeting to discuss the work that needs to be done before action is taken on this issue.

DEBBIE BELCHER, GRANTS WRITER

Debbie Belcher, Grants Writer, discussed the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant with the Board and that the county has received \$250,000 for this grant. On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the Board voted unanimously to advertise for administrative services for this grant. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to resubmit their application for the 2011 CDBG Housing Grant.

SEPTIC TANK RESOLUTION

On a motion by Mr. Lamb and a second by Mr. Jones, the Board voted unanimously to read the Septic Tank Resolution by title only. On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Pridgeon, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Resolution.

APPROVE THE BILLS

On a motion by Mr. Jones and a second by Mr. Lamb, the Board voted unanimously to approve the following bills, with the exception of the Byrd's Power Equipment bill, the Paul Lamb bill, and the Pridgeon's Power Equipment bill:

General Fund - \$406,294.14

E911 Fund - \$1,254.51

Industrial Park Fund - \$571.35

Road & Bridge Secondary Fund - \$140,843.95





A RESOLUTION OF THE LAFAYETTE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO THE STATEWIDE APPLICATION OF NEW SEPTIC TANK INSPECTION AND REPLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

Whereas, SB 550, which creates new septic tank maintenance and inspection requirements, was originally intended to affect those properties with septic tanks in close proximity to Florida's springs, but which was changed in the course of the legislative process to cover all properties with septic tanks wherever located within the state; and

Whereas, the Lafayette County Commission supports the protection of springs and supports strict regulation of septic tanks located close to springs; and

Whereas, Lafayette County does not believe it is appropriate to impose the same strict regulation of septic tanks throughout Lafayette County, even to those septic tanks that are far removed from springs and have no impact on them; and

Whereas, Lafayette County is very concerned about the economic impact of such strict regulation of septic tanks where annual inspection fees and septic tank replacement costs can be substantial and will result in an unnecessary burden on homeowners whose septic tanks have no impact on springs; and

Whereas, the State should be especially cautious about imposing unnecessary burdens on home ownership and home sales during this serious downturn in real estate activity.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESLOVED:

Section 1. The Lafayette County Commission expresses its strong opposition to the implementation of the new septic tank maintenance and inspection requirements outside of springs protection areas.

Section 2. The Lafayette County Commission requests that the Governor and Department of Health delay the implementation of the new septic tank maintenance and inspection requirements until such time as the Legislature has an opportunity to reconsider this ill-advised legislation.

Section 3. Upon adoption, the County Clerk is directed to send a copy of this Resolution to Charlie Christ, Governor; to Ana M. Viamonte Ros, M.D., State Surgeon General and head of the Florida Department of Health; and to the County's legislative delegation.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be effective upon adoption.
