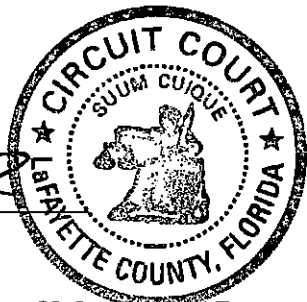

ADDITIONAL EMS CREW

Marty Tompkins met with the Board to discuss response times by the Lafayette County Emergency Medical Services. EMS currently schedules 2 paramedics and 1 ambulance per shift. If they are busy with a call, dispatchers have the following options: they can call another county that we have an Interlocal Agreement with to respond, or call Century Ambulance Service. When these sources are used as back-ups the response time is delayed. Discussions were held to try to decrease this response time. Marty agreed to research the issue and report his findings to the Board at a future meeting.


